Something to ponder in the Year of Mercy – This Year of Mercy represents an excellent opportunity to thank God for His Love and Mercy. God is merciful to those who want his mercy. However, he does not force himself on us. We have the freedom to choose by the way we live our lives. We are wise to remember that God does not owe us forgiveness, redemption, or anything else. Nor does God's mercy license us to continue in sin. It demands a response to "go, and sin no more." To borrow a thought from Augustine: We must not despair, one of the thieves was saved; we must not presume, one of the thieves was damned.

The following is an excerpt from the book "Evangelizing Catholics" by Scott Hahn.

[According to Pope Benedict XVI,] "Success is not one of the names of God." If we measured the value of what Jesus did on earth by the number of people who came to believe in him during his lifetime, we would all be in trouble.

Again, <u>fidelity</u> is what God wants from us. He wants us to live the Gospel, and he wants us to proclaim it. He wants us to love him, and he wants us to lead others to his love.

How each of us does that will be different from how everybody else does that. In his introduction to Rome Sweet Home, Peter Kreeft says that **conversions are like snowflakes: no two are alike**. The same can be said about the forms the work of the New Evangelization will take in each of our lives. The work will look different in every home and every parish. How we go about that work is a question for prayer and discernment.

But we do need to go about it. "Enter by the narrow gate." Jesus tells us: "For the gate is wide and the way is easy that leads to destruction, and those who enter by it are many. For the gate is narrow and the way is hard that leads to life, and those who find it are few" (Mt 7:13-14).

That's Jesus' take on the road to heaven: the gate is narrow and those who find it are few. Our culture's take (a take shared by many Catholics, faithful or otherwise) is just the opposite: the gate to heaven is wide, and those who find it are many.

Nobody knows how many souls are in heaven and how many souls are in hell. That's like asking how many angels can dance on the head of a pin. But, if I'm playing the odds, I'm going with Jesus on this one. *Heaven is not guaranteed.* It's not a sure thing – not for anyone, and especially not for those following the wide, sloping path paved by our culture.

#### RCIA NEWS AT SJB -

The Ten Commandments – Last Sunday, March 13, August Preston, Sharon Santilli and Matt DiGruttolo concluded their study of the Ten Commandments. We read and discussed Chapters 33 and 34 from our RCIA resource: "The Ninth Commandment: Practice Purity of Heart" and "The Tenth Commandment: Embrace Poverty of Spirit." We thank newly confirmed Danielle DiGruttolo for her meaningful participation in the formation session. We are inspired by her commitment to ongoing adult catechesis.

Third Scrutiny and Presentation of the Lord's Prayer – During last Sunday's Mass, August Preston, along with his sponsor, Landa Brunetto, completed the Third Scrutiny. In this rite, celebrated universally with the elect on the Fifth Sunday of Lent, the assembly offered petitions for the elect and the celebrant completed prayers of Exorcism. Subsequently, before commencing the RCIA session, we completed the Presentation of the Lord's Prayer. In this simple but elegant rite, led by Deacon Azzola, we prayerfully offered the Lord's Prayer to the elect.

Candidate Retreat – On Holy Saturday, March 26, August Preston, Sharon Santilli and Matt DiGruttolo are scheduled to complete their candidate retreat. The retreat – entailing prayer, reflection and preparation rites – will be conducted at St. Timothy Parish. We extend our thanks, in advance, to Father Timothy Hayes and Rita Feige, the Director of Religious Education, with St. Timothy Parish for their coordination and execution of this most important retreat. This formation event will conclude our RCIA program's final preparations for the Easter Vigil rites.

We invite all Saint John the Baptist parishioners to continue praying for our elect and candidates; and to attend the Easter Vigil Mass at our beloved parish.
