**Solemnity of Pentecost**

**Dear Parishioners,**

**Over two years ago, Fr. Carvalho asked me to come to St. John the Baptist Church to help him with his many responsibilities here. So, after years of Diaconal Service at Delaware St. Mary Parish, I felt called to lend my services here at St. John's.**

**My purpose was to provide some help to him in the many needs of the Parish. Critical areas of concern were: assistance at Sunday Masses, the celebration of the Sacraments (Baptisms, Weddings, Funerals, etc...), and some attention to the prayer life and devotional traditions of St. John the Baptist.**

**With the assignment of Fr. Anthony Lonzo as Associate Administrator of both Sacred Heart and St. John the Baptist Parishes, my original mission is accomplished, for he is providing the direction and stability needed in the Parish.**

**In a letter of resignation to Fr. Carvalho, I have set the date of 26 June 2016 as my last day of service here at the Parish. That day is the external celebration of St. John the Baptist, the Patron Saint of this Church. That seems to be a good date and a fitting occasion for a closure of my service here.**

**This Parish, which I have known since I came to this Country as a young PIME Seminarian in 1966 (it seems like yesterday...!), has a soft spot in my heart, and will always remain such. I have visited this Church countless times and helped the previous Pastors in whatever ways I could.**

**Thank you for the opportunity to serve here, even if only for two short years. As I leave this Parish in an official capacity, I hope to remain in touch with the many of you whom I have gotten to know and love for the past two years. My grateful thanks to those of you who worked closely with me on different projects and have helped me so much.**

**I will also be glad to honor occasional requests for my ministry or my presence here at St. John's, with the prior approval and permission of Fr. Carvalho or Fr. Lonzo.**

**I pray that the Lord may bless all the Parishioners of this Parish, and that they all may be courageous messengers of the Gospel of Jesus Christ, with St. John the Baptist as their example and intercessor.**

**Please pray for me that the Holy Spirit, whose powerful presence in the Church we celebrate today, and Mary, our loving Mother, may guide me in the days ahead as I continue to serve as Deacon in the Diocese of Columbus.**
