RECONCILIATION/CONFESSIONE:

One half-hour prior to weekend Mass or by request/appointment.

BAPTISM/BATTESIMO:

Preparation is required for the reception of the sacrament.

Parents are encouraged to call the Rectory and set up an appointment before the birth of their child.

MATRIMONY/MATRIMONIO:

Arrangements should be made at least six or more months in advance. A marriage preparation program is required.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK/INFERMI:

In cases of emergencies, please call anytime. Please notify the
Parish Office for Communion calls to the sick, shut-ins.

Due to privacy laws, if parishioners wish to be visited in the hospital, they should contact the Parish Office directly and give the information regarding the hospitalization.

From the Deacon's Desk Dear friends in Christ, What a difference a week makes!!!

Last **Sunday**, we were surrounded by the sounds and sights of the **40th Italian Festival** here at **Saint John** the **Baptist Catholic Church** and now, this weekend, all is quiet, calm and "back to

normal" for another 51 weeks. As I was

standing with **Bishop Brennan** on the steps of our **120+ year old church** building getting ready for **Mass**, I couldn't help become grateful once again for all who came before us and whose shoulders we stand on that built this great parish.

We all know that long before our time, some of the great cathedrals and churches around the world took centuries to build. The architects who drew the plans, the artists who contributed to their craft, the patrons who put up money, and the workers who quarried the stone, steel, wood work and laid the foundation on many of these great structures knew they would never worship in the building they were helping to construct. Even their children and grandchildren would not enjoy the beauty of the sanctuary. Still, they hauled stone after stone and set it in place. They did it for the future, for a church that was yet to be imagined. Sometimes, total dedication and perseverance to someone or something beyond yourself is the most enriching and satisfying way to live. And so each generation persists in the pursuit of its dreams.

Persistence in prayer, as in the cause of cathedral-building, child rearing, or justice activism is not always easy. This weekend, we will read about **Moses**, his brother, **Aaron**, his friends on either sides holding Moses' arms up in persistent prayer. We will reflect on the persistence of **Saint Paul**. We will listen to **Jesus** tell the story of the widow who simply "badgered" or kept after the judge in the story until she got what she needed. We know it took a village to put on our annual Festival, the same way it takes a village to raise a child or build a parish...to "hold up our arms" in prayer early and often.

We all have the celebration of weekly **Mass**, reception of the **Eucharist** to strengthen us, but we also have family prayer at home and with groups that gather for recitation of the Rosary, scripture reflection and silent contemplation. Prayer is not easy, but it is also not optional. As we saw last weekend, with support over the generations, our efforts can be built as living stones into something greater than we can imagine.

Saint John the Baptist, pray for us!




