


From the Deacon's Desk

During Lent we do spiritual "spring cleaning." Reviewing the Ten **Commandments** is a good place to start. Based on natural law, they make sense: give God and neighbor what is due to them. But Jesus wants more radical cleansing – beyond the letter of the Law, beyond human wisdom, beyond what makes sense. Jesus invites us into what St. Paul calls in our second reading the foolishness of God, the folly of the cross. The Church asks us each year to do spring cleaning. We are called to go again to the center of our faith: our share in Christ's death and resurrection. We are asked to examine how our convictions and practice may have gathered dust during the past year.

We celebrate the foolishness of God's Wisdom at every Mass. We proclaim the death of the Lord. We say "amen" to letting that death penetrate our lives. We feed upon the sacrificed Body of Christ. May we get the message right this year, this Lent. May we be fools for the sake of Jesus and know the renewal and life that only such foolishness can bring.

US Church Regulations Regarding Fasting and Abstinence During Lent: Abstinence from meat (beast or fowl) is to be observed by all Catholics fourteen years and older on Ash Wednesday and on all Fridays of Lent. This obligation prohibits the eating of meat, but not eggs, milk products or condiments of any kind, even though made from animal fat. The law of fasting on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday applies to all Catholics from age 18 through age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. Those who are ill or pregnant may be dispensed from their obligation.

It's Fish Fry Time: One of the great parts of Lent is the return of that wonderful Catholic institution, the Friday Fish Fry. COVID has allowed may parishes to move to carry-out only. But the fish is still excellent, and you do not have to cook! Please go to columbuscatholic.org for a complete list of the Fish Fries being offered throughout the Columbus area during Lent.

40 Days of Adoration: Bishop Robert Brennan calls upon the Diocese of Columbus to celebrate Jesus Christ's Real Presence in Eucharist in a special way this Lent. 40 Days of Adoration started February 17, Ash Wednesday. Every day for 40 days, a different parish throughout the diocese will host Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament for Adoration throughout the day. Reconciliation Monday

On Monday of Holy Week, March 29th, priests will be available in every church of the diocese between 4:00-7:00 p.m. for the Sacrament of Reconciliation or Confession. The special time for Confession is in addition to the parish's normal Lenten Confession times.

Lenten Reflection: Our Christian hope begins with inspiration. Jesus awakens us spiritually and plants within us the desire to live out of love, faith, wisdom, and justice. Balancing act

Saint Paul lived in that perilous posture you see in cartoon characters whose feet are on opposite supports that are swiftly gliding apart. As a privileged Roman citizen of Cilicia (modern Turkey), Paul had one foot firmly planted in the reality of Greco-Roman culture. Yet the other was just as securely fixed in his Jewish faith. It was a tough posture to maintain. Then Paul encountered the Risen Lord and understood in the gospel the most excellent way to unite Jews and Greeks in an elegantly reconciling Christian message. Christianity is for uniting, not dividing.

As we practice Lenten abstinence today, we might keep in mind these words from fourth-century Saint Basil the Great: "True fast is the estrangement from evil, temperance of tongue, abstinence from anger, separation from desires, slander, falsehood, and perjury. Privation of these is true fasting." Being mindful of what goes into our mouths is important today, but being mindful of what comes out of them, even more so. Strive to abstain from the unkind, false, or hostile word today. And if you find you have broken the fast, make amends as best you can. Let this be your spiritual discipline today.

Pray the mercy mantra

Gregory Palamas, a saint of the Eastern Orthodox, Melkite, and Ukrainian Catholic Churches, taught that the use of the Jesus Prayer—"Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy on me, a sinner"—prepares one to receive the grace-filled light of the Lord. This short, formulaic prayer has its roots in today's parable of the Pharisee and the Tax Collector. Saint John Paul II repeatedly cited Palamas as one of the great spiritual writers of history. Today, join with John Paul II and Palamas in heaven and the multitude of Catholics throughout the world who recite this spiritual mantra over and over again seeking the Lord's mercy.
