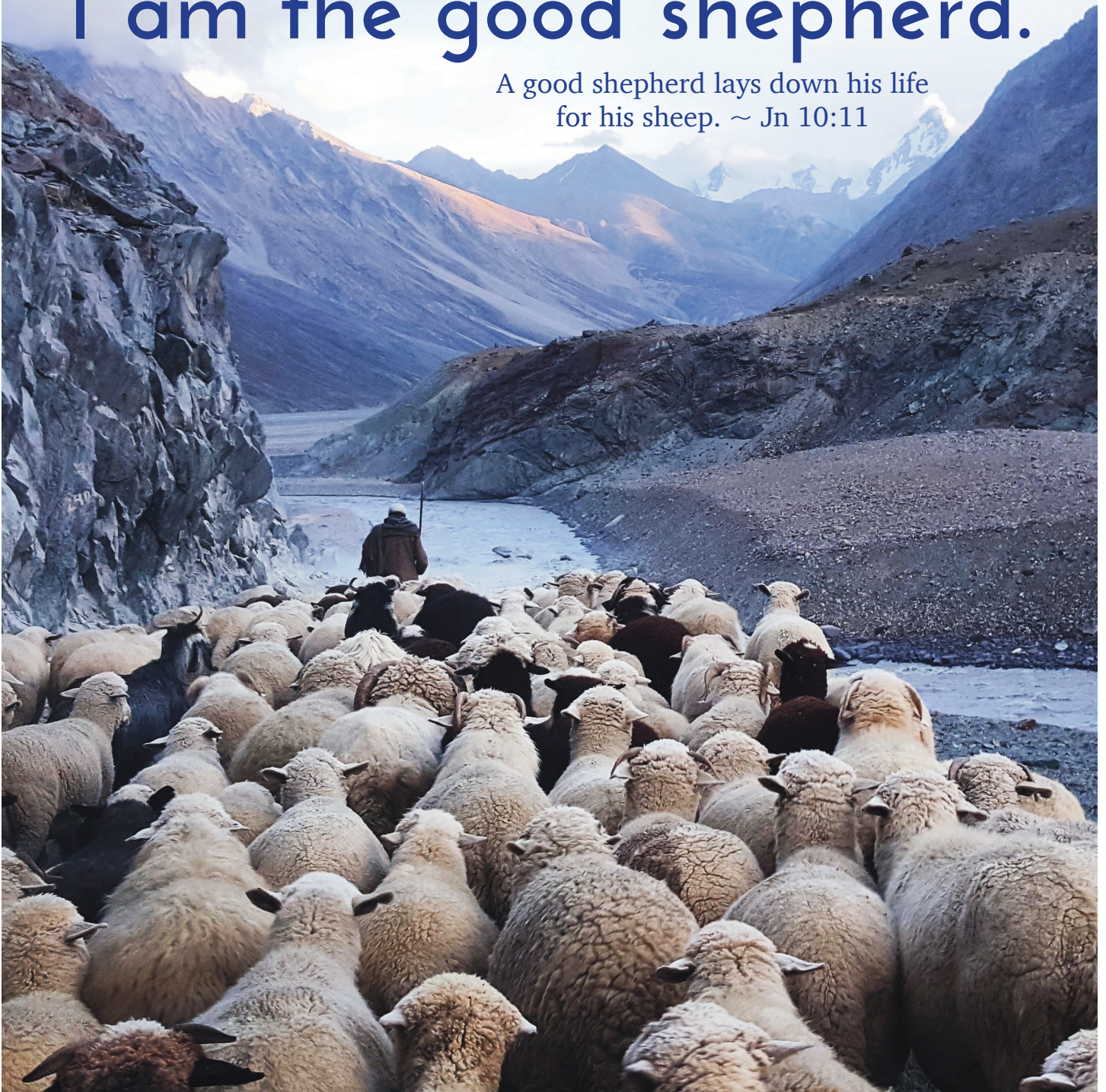


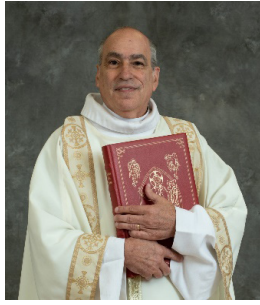

From the Deacon's Desk*Dear friends in Christ,*

The fourth **Sunday** of **Easter** is traditionally called **Good Shepherd Sunday**. Most **Christians** have grown up with the stained-glass image of Jesus as the **Good Shepherd**, carrying the lost lamb on His shoulders. It is a comforting, reassuring image we reiterate every time we repeat the **Twenty-third Psalm**.

But how many of us have honestly ever identified ourselves with that lamb and the reasons why the lamb got lost in the first place? We like to describe ourselves as “**strong as an ox**,” or as “**gentle as a dove**,” or as “**courageous as a lion**”...but few of us would choose to compare ourselves with a sheep. And yet that is how the **Bible** describes us, all of us, and thus we need a shepherd, a **Good Shepherd**, who is willing to lay down His life, not for just the strong, gentle, courageous, and saintly people of the world only, but for unintelligent, wandering, fall-over-the-cliff again and again, sheep. It was for sheep that He died. While we were yet helpless sheep, He gave His life for our life.

This is the whole story of Good Shepherd. Saint John the Baptist pray for us!

The Holy Father's Intentions for the Month of April 2021: We pray for those who risk their lives while fighting for fundamental rights under dictatorships, authoritarian regimes and even in democracies in crisis.

Liturgical Calendar: The month of April is dedicated to **The Holy Spirit**. The first three days of the month fall during the season of **Lent**, which is represented by the liturgical color purple – a symbol of penance, mortification and the sorrow of a contrite heart. The remainder of April falls during the **Easter** season, which is represented by the liturgical color white – the color of light, a symbol of joy, purity and innocence (absolute or restored).



Exposition and Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament: Daily Masses at Sacred Heart will be offered at 8:00 p.m. on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays. Exposition and Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, starting at 7:00 p.m. Confessions will be heard during the time of Adoration.

Good Shepherd Sunday: This fourth **Sunday** of the **Easter** season is sometimes called **Good Shepherd Sunday** because in each of the three lectionary cycles, the **Gospel** reading invites us to reflect on **Jesus** as the **Good Shepherd**. In each cycle the reading is from the tenth chapter of **John's Gospel**. This chapter sets the framework for **Jesus'** teaching about Himself as the **Good Shepherd**.

Lord, Grant Us Your Peace

Think about the things that are good and worthy of praise. **God** is ready to give **His** peace to you. **God's** peace will make you sleep well tonight and will make you smile tomorrow. You will reframe the way you face your fears. You will learn to talk yourself off the ledge. You will view bad news through the lens of **God's** sovereignty. You will tell yourself the truth. It is not **God's** will for you to live in a perpetual state of fear and anxiety. It is not **God's** will that you face every day with dread and trepidation. **Jesus** spoke to storms. **He** will speak to your own storms, too. **Jesus** calmed the hearts of the **Apostles**. **He** will calm yours, too. **Jesus** told them not to fear. **He** will say the same to you. We are weary of our worry. We are being battered by the storms of life. May the **Prince of Peace** send the spirit of calmness. As we go through the storms of life, help us quench our anxiety and help us stir our courage, in your **Most Holy Name**, we pray.

1. Rejoice in the Lord always. Celebrate God's goodness.
2. Let your requests be known to God. Ask God for help.
3. Leave your problems in God's hands... with thanksgiving.
4. Meditate on good things.

Live with purpose

Nothing need limit your devotion

The life of Saint Rafael Arnáiz Barón was interrupted by illness. Having endured a pandemic, we know what that's like—we've seen lives cut short by disease and we ourselves have had to put some of our own living on hold. Rafael was born in Spain in 1911 and died at 27. He was a talented artist and studied architecture, then decided to become a Trappist. Severe complications from diabetes prevented him from taking vows as a monk. He accepted God's will, joined as an oblate instead, and died young of his illness. In him you can find an example of surrender, trust, and devotion in the face of loss and disappointment that makes him a model for our times a century later.

Plant the seeds of belief

The Syrian city of Antioch played a pivotal role in the growth of the early church. A cross-cultural safe haven, it was here that many of Jesus' first followers—all of them Jewish—took refuge after Stephen was martyred, fleeing Jerusalem as they too became targets. Antioch was a cosmopolitan hothouse, its Jews enjoying friendly interactions with the city's many Gentiles. Once new Jews arrived, bearing witness to Jesus, local Gentiles couldn't help but be intrigued. Soon, the fledgling church of Antioch began evangelizing Gentiles intentionally, planting the seed of belief in unexpected places. Where might you plant such seeds?

TODAY'S READINGS: Acts 11:19-26; John 10:22-30 (280). "It was in Antioch that the disciples were first called Christians."

MEMORIAL OF PETER CHANEL, PRIEST, RELIGIOUS, MISSIONARY, MARTYR

Let your life bring light to others

There is good reason that Peter Chanel (1803-41) is the patron saint of Oceania. A parish priest from France who later joined the Marist missionaries, Peter was missioned to Western Oceania to convert people who worshipped other gods. Peter's missionary method was low key: He learned the language of the people and cared for their sick. For a few years, all was fine until small groups of native people began to be baptized, in particular, the son and daughter of the island king. Peter was then considered a threat to

the island's power elite. On this day in 1841 he was murdered. That is not the end of Peter's story, however. Within two years of his death, the entire island had become Catholic. How do you bring the light of faith to people around you?

TODAY'S READINGS: Acts 12:24—13:5a; John 12:44-50 (281). "I came into the world as light, so that everyone who believes in me might not remain in darkness."

MEMORIAL OF CATHERINE OF SIENA, VIRGIN, DOCTOR OF THE CHURCH

Not how long a life is, but how good

Saint Catherine of Siena led a remarkable life for a person of any era but particularly for a woman of the 14th century who only lived 33 years. Mystic, nurse, Dominican, counselor, arbitrator, writer, ambassador—she was all these things. Ordinary people came to her for spiritual council and advice in conflicts, leading her to eventually settle fierce church disputes, becoming a confidante of popes. Central to her strength was her union with Christ, which she wrote about in the classic, *The Dialogue*. Find a quiet moment today to—like Catherine—commune with Jesus, who offers wisdom and strength to all.

TODAY'S READINGS: Acts 13:13-25; John 13:16-20 (282). "Whoever receives the one I send receives me, and whoever receives me receives the one who sent me."

Try a little tenderness

When God became flesh and dwelt among us, a revolution was started. Not a military coup that some people expected, but a revolution that would strike deep at the heart. This "revolution of tenderness," as Pope Francis called it in *Evangelii Gaudium*, urges each and every one of us to give of ourselves, to be part of community, to serve, and to be reconciled in our relationships with others. In what ways can you respond to Jesus' call to a revolution of tenderness?

TODAY'S READINGS: Acts 13:26-33; John 14:1-6 (283). "Do not let your hearts be troubled. You have faith in God; have faith also in me."

MEMORIAL OF JOSEPH THE WORKER

Wanting for a job

Today's memorial honors Saint Joseph the carpenter, standing in solidarity with all working people on the traditional "May Day" dedicated to laborers around the world. At this time last year, more than 30 million Americans had lost their jobs due to the pandemic, the largest unemployment crisis in the country's history. Many of those jobs have not returned and likely are gone forever. What can you and your faith community do to support those whose livelihoods were lost to the virus?

TODAY'S READINGS: Genesis 1:26—2:3 or Colossians 3:14-15, 17, 23-24; Matthew 13:54-58 (559); Acts 13:44-52; John 14:7-14 (284). "If you ask anything of me in my name, I will do it."
