AROUND US

Liturgical Calendar: The first 24 days of December fall during the liturgical season known as **Advent** and are represented by the liturgical color purple – a symbol of penance, mortification and the sorrow of a contrite heart. The remaining days of December mark the beginning of the **Christmas** season. The liturgical color changes to white or gold – a symbol of joy, purity, and innocence. The month of December is also dedicated to the **Immaculate Conception**.

Christmas Catholic Charities Collection: This annual collection allows the diocese to meet a variety of basic needs directly and through diocesan agencies and organizations including **J.O.I.N. (Joint Organization for Inner-City Needs)**, **St. Stephen's Community House**, **Catholic Social Services**, **St. Francis Center**, **St. Lawrence Haven**, **St. Vincent Family Center**, and the **Society of St. Vincent de Paul**. You can help share in this important work by generously supporting the **Catholic Charities** collection this year.

Tornado Relief Collection: Last week, there was unexpected destruction caused in **Kentucky** and other parts of the **American** south caused by the horrific outbreak of tornadoes. The recovery is expected to take a long time, and many government and social aid agencies, including **Catholic Charities USA**, are already working tirelessly to bring comfort and relief to the many people affected by this disaster. Additional support is needed. However, in times of tragedy, we are reminded that the **Church** is always a primary source of healing and assistance. The **United States Conference of Catholic Bishops** has requested that funds be collected for **Catholic Charities U.S.A.** These funds will be used to support the efforts of **CUSA's** efforts to reach out and provide humanitarian aid in **Kentucky** and other affected parts of the country. **St. John** will be taking up a **2nd collection** on **Sunday, January 2, 2022**. Thank you for your generosity!

Women's and Men's Conferences 2022: The **Women's Conference** will be on **Saturday, February 19**, and the **Men's Conference** on the following **Saturday, February 26, 2022**, both at the **Ohio Expo Center**. The invitations for confessions will be mailed.

January 1: Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God: This feast is the celebration of **Mary's** motherhood of **Jesus**. On this day, we are reminded of the role that the **Blessed Virgin** played in the plan of our salvation. Calling **Mary** "**Mother of God**" is the highest honor we can give to her. Just as Christmas honors **Jesus** as the "**Prince of Peace**," the **Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God** honors **Mary** as the "**Queen of Peace**." **New Year's Day** is also designated as the **World Day of Peace**, further acknowledging the role of **Mary** in our hearts and in our world.



Feast of the Holy Family: Today, we honor the **Holy Family**. The devotion to the **Holy Family** was born in **Bethlehem**, together with the **Baby Jesus**. The shepherds went to adore the **Child**, and, at the same time, they gave honor to **His** family. Later, the three wise men came from the East to adore and give honor to the newborn **King** with gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh that would be safeguarded by His family.

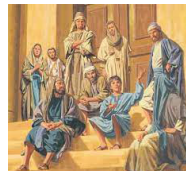

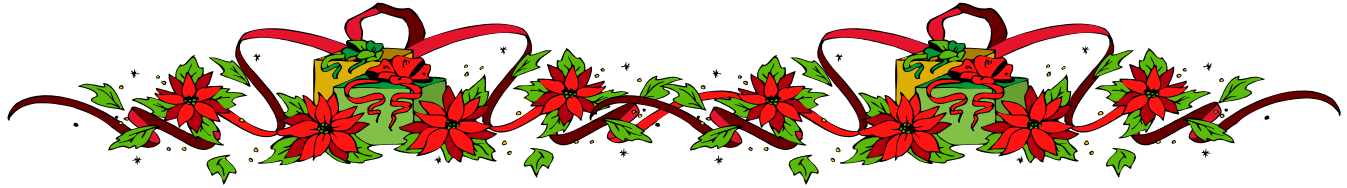

FEAST OF THE HOLY FAMILY OF JESUS, MARY, AND JOSEPH

Bless the children

Holy families aren't necessarily picture-perfect. But they are faithful and consistent in their values and goals. Like Mary and Joseph and biblical parents before them, holy families consecrate their children early and often to the care of God. They do this by baptizing them and seeing to their sacramental preparation. They do this by praying for and with their little ones. They provide them a religious education and share faith-filled practices of compassion and charity. All the children in our lives look to us for love and acceptance, guidance and Christian example. Teach the children well.

TODAY'S READINGS: Sirach 3:2-6, 12-14; Colossians 3:12-21; Luke 2:41-52 (17A); or 1 Samuel 1:20-22, 24-28; 1 John 3:1-2, 21-24; Luke 2:41-52 (17C). *"Once the child is weaned, I will take him to appear before the LORD and to remain there forever."*

Monday, Dec 27, 2021

FEAST OF JOHN, APOSTLE AND EVANGELIST

He lived to tell the tale

John the Apostle is credited with being the author of the Gospel of John. He is also believed to have been the "Beloved Disciple" of Jesus mentioned in that gospel and is presumed to have outlived the other apostles, perhaps being the only one to die of natural causes rather than martyrdom. Imagine being the last survivor, and the heartache he endured on losing his peers to violent deaths for their faith. Perhaps it was John's job to live to tell the story—"that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that believing you may have life in his name"—as he says in his final line. Take John's mission to heart and embrace his good word today.

TODAY'S READINGS: 1 John 1:1-4; John 20:1a, 2-8 (697). *"Then the other disciple also went in, the one who had arrived at the tomb first, and he saw and believed."*

FEAST OF THE HOLY INNOCENTS, MARTYRS

Children deserve protection

Nowadays when we think of Christmas pageants, we envision adorable children in bathrobes dressed as shepherds. But in the Middle Ages, religious pageants were a serious business. The whole community gathered to enact mystery plays that told the stories of birth, death, resurrection, and the lives of the saints. It's from such a mystery play that we get the haunting words and melody of "The Coventry Carol"—a song about King Herod's slaughter of the Holy Innocents that asks plaintively, "What may we do to preserve . . . this poor youngling for whom we sing?" Pray today for children who continue to suffer and face certain death without our help.

TODAY'S READINGS: 1 John 1:5—2:2; Matthew 2:13-18 (698). *"A voice was heard in Ramah, sobbing and loud lamentation; Rachel weeping for her children."*

FIFTH DAY WITHIN THE OCTAVE OF NATIVITY OF THE LORD; MEMORIAL OF THOMAS BECKET, BISHOP, MARTYR

Choose God

Everyone must at times make the choice of serving God or something less. Today we remember Saint Thomas Becket, bishop of Canterbury. Thomas was faced with such a dilemma

when his friend the king, Henry II, continuously tried to interfere with church matters. Allowing the king to interfere with the church would have allowed Thomas to be in the king's good graces. Instead, Thomas chose to serve God above anything and anyone else, even at the cost of martyrdom. "When is constancy required," Thomas writes, "except under persecution. Are not friends then proved? If they always yield, how can they ever succeed? They must, one time or other, make a stand."

TODAY'S READINGS: 1 John 2:3-11; Luke 2:22-35 (202). *"And you yourself a sword will pierce so that the thoughts of many hearts may be revealed."*

SIXTH DAY WITHIN THE OCTAVE OF THE NATIVITY OF THE LORD

Take your time to absorb Christmas

Today we continue as a church to honor the feast of our Savior's birth. It is day six in the octave of Christmas—the eight-day liturgical focus on the birth of Christ. The entrance of the Christ into human history is such a significant event that the church notes its magnitude by keeping our gaze on it through the specified readings, psalms, and prayers during these eight days. Take a moment today to allow the wonder of God-among-us to continue to sink in.

TODAY'S READINGS: 1 John 2:12-17; Luke 2:36-40 (203). *"She gave thanks to God and spoke about the child to all who were awaiting the redemption of Jerusalem."*
