From the Deacon's Desk**Dear friends in Christ,**

Today we hear the final chapter of **John's** gospel. This last chapter seems to be trying to sort out some unfinished business, namely the denial of **Jesus** by **Peter**. It is the story of **Peter's** reconciliation.

It has **three** parts:

- 1.) **Peter** returns unsuccessfully to fishing until **Jesus** appears and advises the fishermen what to do.
- 2.) **Jesus** then gently challenges **Peter** and finally foretells what **Peter's** end will be.
- 3.) **Jesus's** final words take us back to **Peter's** original calling. They are very simple: "**Follow me.**"

If the Resurrection stories in general offer a summary of the Gospel message, these **three** sections remind us of **three significant truths**:

- 1.) **Peter** attempts to return to his old profession but, without the presence of **Jesus**, even here He is unsuccessful.
- 2.) Once **Jesus** appears on the scene the situation is transformed.
- 3.) We are reminded of similar stories in the gospels where **Jesus** springs abundance; He is an overflowing source of nourishment and goodness.

We may apply the **threefold message to ourselves**:

- 1.) We will get nowhere by ourselves. We need the presence of **Christ** and His love to touch our hearts and enrich us through our faith and prayer, through the sacraments and through the love we receive from our fellow **Christians**.
- 2.) Our response, our love for **Christ** is, however, only seen and given shape in our love for others, especially those in need. To do this, we have to overcome our own selfishness and fears that push us to close ourselves down and not be opened to the world beyond us.
- 3.) It is this sense of welcoming the challenge of the world that lies beyond us that will not only give us a share in the calling of the risen **Lord**. It will also help us deal with whatever life may demand of us in carrying out our response to the challenge.

This will be our answer to the same question **Jesus** asked of us: "**Do you love me?**" – and also, to **Jesus's** final instruction: "**Follow me.**"

Saint John the Baptist, pray for us!

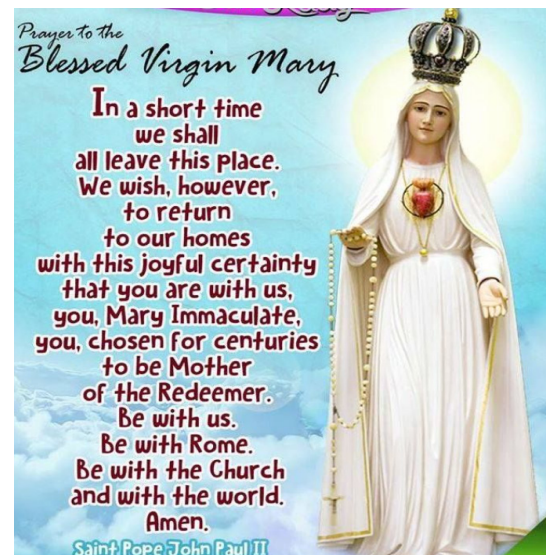

Crown thy good with brotherhood

Today on Religious Brothers Day, we're reminded how "The vocation of the brother is part of the answer that God gives to the absence of brotherhood which is wounding the world today" (*Identity and Mission of the Religious Brother in the Church*). If you feel stirred to be a special kind of brother to those in need, consider casting your net in the direction of this unique vocation.

TODAY'S READINGS: Acts 5:27-32, 40b-41; Revelation 5:11-14; John 21:1-19 (48). "Cast the net over the right side of the boat and you will find something."

MEMORIAL OF ATHANASIUS, BISHOP, DOCTOR OF THE CHURCH

Stand and be counted

Called "Father of Orthodoxy," "Pillar of the Church," and "Champion of Christ's Divinity," Saint Athanasius the Great was an extraordinary early Christian leader. He was the bishop of Alexandria and best known for fighting the heresy of Arianism, which argued that Jesus was begotten by, but not co-eternal with, God the Father. He suffered for his efforts though, making lots of enemies and spending 17 years in exile. Historian Cornelius Clifford said of him: "His career almost personifies a crisis in the history of Christianity." You may not earn the honorific the "Great," but can you stand up for the truth even if it costs you something?

TODAY'S READINGS: Acts 6:8-15; John 6:22-29 (273). "This is the work of God, that you believe in the one he sent."

FEAST OF PHILIP AND JAMES, APOSTLES

Team up

Saint James the Lesser gets paired with various religious figures. He shares today's feast with Philip because their martyred bodies arrived together for burial. He shares his first name with Saint James the Greater, one of the first disciples to follow Jesus and the first apostle martyred. But James the Lesser—named for being younger than the elder James—is best known for being partnered with Jesus. Called the "brother of the Lord" though actually a cousin, legend says James looked so much like Jesus that even the Virgin Mary had trouble telling them apart. It is good to have a partner in faith to rely on.

TODAY'S READINGS: 1 Corinthians 15:1-8; John 14:6-14 (561). "He appeared to James, then to all the Apostles."

Spread the good word

On this day in 1493, Pope Alexander VI issued his monumental papal bull *Inter caetera*, meant to resolve a dispute between the kings of Spain and Portugal concerning exploration and colonization of the Americas. The document helped spread the Catholic faith across the Americas but also led to brutal

colonialism and slavery in the same lands. As the church continues to live in the long shadow of this watershed document, its core wish still rings true: that "the Catholic faith and the Christian religion be exalted and be everywhere increased and spread."

TODAY'S READINGS: Acts 8:1b-8; John 6:35-40 (275). "Let all the earth cry out to God with joy."

Viva our vibrant church

Today is Cinco de Mayo, a commemoration of a key Mexican military victory that, in the United States, has evolved into a general celebration of Mexican culture. Mexican Americans have made enormous contributions to the U.S. church, which is rapidly becoming majority-Hispanic. Take a moment today to learn about the V Encuentro, a broad-based effort to listen and respond to the wisdom and the needs of Latinos in the U.S. church.

Follow the way of healing

"Healing is an essential dimension of the apostolic mission and of Christian faith," says Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI in his book *Jesus of Nazareth* (2007). "It can even be said that Christianity is a 'therapeutic religion, a religion of healing.'" Much of healing is beyond our control, whether it comes from divine grace or medical resources available to us. However, as disciples of Christ, we can be a healing presence to those who are sick and suffering by listening more than speaking and avoiding the temptation to have all the answers in situations that remain a mystery.

Welcome back

It was hard to be a Christian during the early persecutions of the church. Many neophytes quit the faith to avoid imprisonment, torture, and even death. But when the persecutions ended with the Edict of Milan in 313, the question arose of whether they should be allowed back into the church. From that controversy it became apparent that the church was not an elite body of the sanctified, but a mix of saints and sinners, like the field of wheat and weeds. For the church to truly embody Christ, it must be dedicated to forgiveness and an open-door policy. Who can you forgive today?

TODAY'S READINGS: Acts 9:31-42; John 6:60-69 (278). "Jesus then said to the Twelve, 'Do you also want to leave?'"
