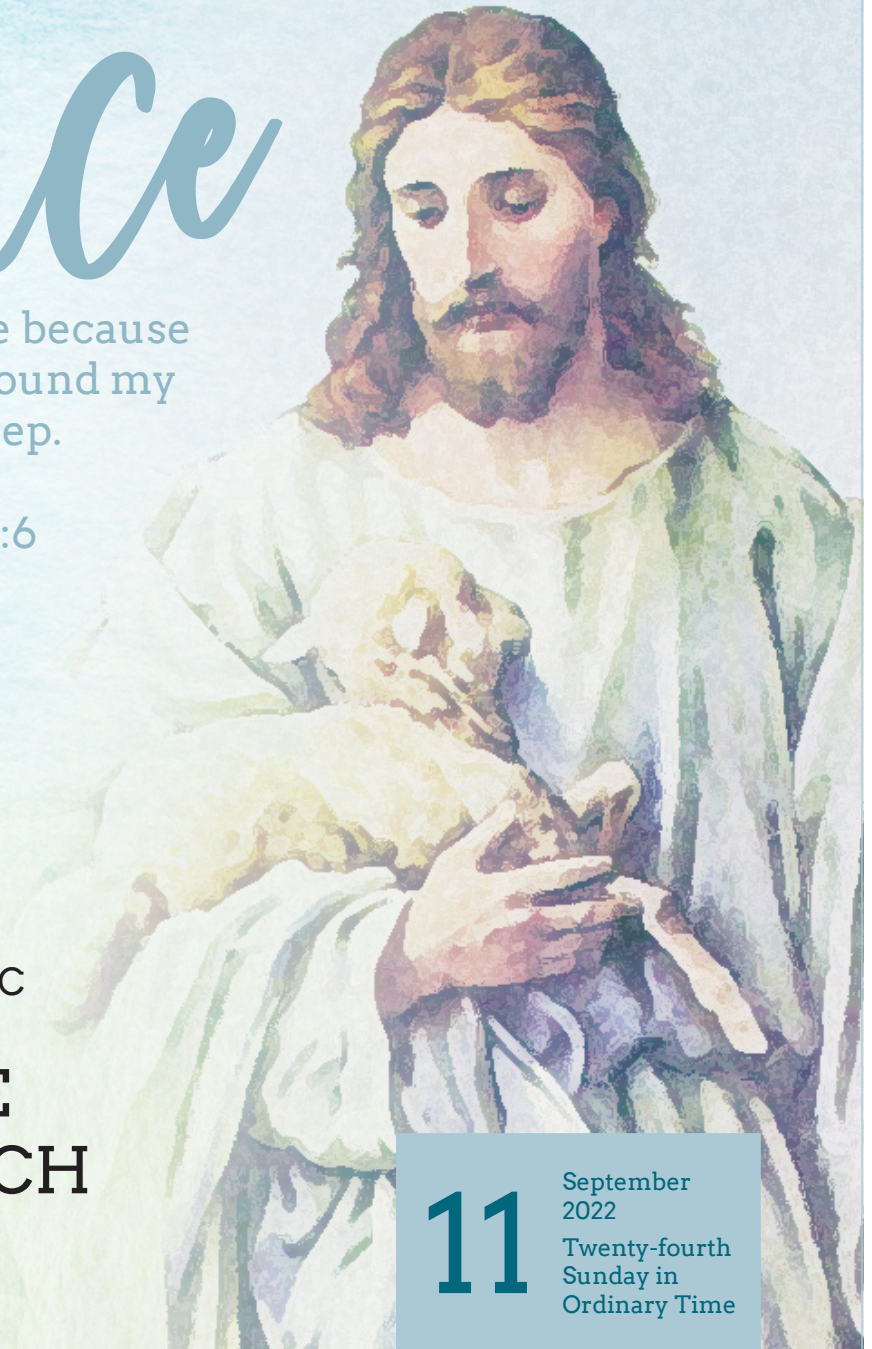

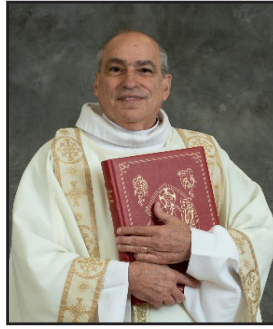

# ITALIAN FESTIVAL 2022

**From the Deacon's Desk**  
**Dear friends in Christ,**



According to **Pope Francis**, homilies should awaken souls – not put them to sleep. **Pope Francis** advises bishops, priests, and deacons to notice while they preach if the people continuously keep looking at their watches. **American Catholics** have been known to forgive a multitude of sins if their priests and deacons offer good homilies.

In this weekend's **Gospel** from **Saint Luke**, the evangelist has **Jesus** engaging His listeners with three very familiar stories – the parables of **The Lost Sheep**, **The Lost Coin**, and **The Lost Two Sons** – to get their attention of what He is trying to teach about the reign of **God**. **Jesus'** stories draw out the whole range of emotions: disbelief, anger, fascination, surprise, upset, joy, and hope. You name it. Nobody dozed off when **Jesus** told a story. Not everyone liked what they heard. Some may even have said, "**Somebody's going to kill this man.**" The theologian **Father Hans Kung** once wrote, "... **Jesus** reveals that **God** is 'one who identifies with us, our needs and hopes, who doesn't demand but lifts, who doesn't wound but heals, who forgives not condemns, who liberates rather than punishes...'"

All **Gospel** parables point to an authentic spiritual life dependent on **God's** unrestricted, other-centered love. **Jesus** continually described the reign of **God**; with every parable, he pointed to our total dependence on **God** alone. So must our homilies and the whole of our worship be - for that matter, all of **Christian** life. May we approach the **Eucharistic** table for the banquet of **God's** reign in this spirit, to sustain us along this path.

**Saint John the Baptist, pray for us.**

**MARRIAGE AND FAMILY LIFE OFFICE:** No-Cost Programs for Natural Family Planning and Fertility Awareness: **Catholic Couples NFP** (<https://ccnfp.org/>), in partnership with **My Catholic Doctor**, has programs for teaching **Fertility Awareness** and **Natural Family Planning** at no cost to **Catholic** couples. Eligible couples include those married in the **Catholic Church**, married in civil marriage, or living together in common-law marriage, at least one of whom must be **Catholic** or enrolled in **RCIA**. There is also a no-cost program for adult **Catholic Women**, and an adolescent program in **Fertility Awareness**. **CCNFP's** no-cost program is recommended by the **USCCB NFP Program**, and available in **English and Spanish**.

**Today's Gospel:** The Gospel is from **St. Luke 15:1-32**. The lesson that these stories have for us is a lesson of hope and confidence in the infinite mercy of **God**. We are all sinners in one way or another. We have all gone astray, got lost like the sheep and the coin. We are all capable of going astray from **God** at any moment. If we met only the justice of **God**, we might well despair. Our chances of reaching heaven would be slight indeed. We are dealing, however, with a **God** of infinite mercy, who loves us with a love we cannot grasp or understand. All this infinite mercy of **God** is there for our benefit if we have the breath of life in us in this world. We are all sinners to a greater or lesser degree, but with the knowledge and conviction of the infinite mercy of **God**, no sinner needs ever, and should never, despair. No sinner was ever lost, and no sinner will ever be lost, because of his sins. Sinners are lost only because they will not trust and believe in **God's** mercy and turn to **Him** to ask for pardon. Turn to **God** today with a truly contrite heart. **God** will do the rest.

### Forget them not

The commemoration of Grandparents' Day the second Sunday of September was signed into law by President Carter in 1978. On this day we honor elders who fill in as parents. Oprah Winfrey, Carol Burnett, Jack Nicholson, Maya Angelou, Willie Nelson, and Presidents Obama and Clinton are among the 2 percent of U.S. children raised by grandparents. The designated flowers for this day are forget-me-nots, a clever reference to how elders can be overlooked in a fast-paced world. These elders also reclaim the overlooked, providing encouragement for the lost sheep in our family systems. Honor your grandparents, living and deceased.

## Monday, Sep 12, 2022

### A name for the ages

Mary, the mother of Jesus, is known to us by many names and titles: Virgin Mary, Blessed Mother, Our Lady, Queen of Heaven, Star of the Sea, Mystical Rose, Untier of Knots, Cause of Our Salvation—and the list goes on. Catholics venerate her actual name "Mary" because it belongs to the mother of God. In the Aramaic language that she and Jesus spoke, her name was pronounced "Mariam," and by some accounts it meant "bitterness." Mary knew terrible suffering as well as great joy. Whatever you are going through, you can bring it to Mary and call on her for help—by any and all of her names. Say a Litany of the Blessed Virgin Mary today.

TODAY'S READINGS: 1 Corinthians 11:17-26, 33; Luke 7:1-10 (443). *"I did not consider myself worthy to come to you; but say the word and let my servant be healed."*

## Tuesday, Sep 13, 2022

### Nearer my God to Thee—times three

Beauty, goodness, and truth—known in theology as the "three transcendentals"—naturally uplift humans toward the Divine. Saint John Chrysostom tapped all three. His preaching was so beautiful that he earned the name *Chrysostomos*, meaning "golden mouth." As archbishop of Constantinople, he exemplified goodness by using his household budget to take care of the poor and build hospitals. But it was John's tapping of biblical truth—admonishing the wealthy and politicians for abuses of privilege and prestige—that got him into hot water with the powers that be, ultimately contributing to his death.

TODAY'S READINGS: 1 Corinthians 12:12-14, 27-31a; Luke 7:11-17 (444). *"Strive eagerly for the greatest spiritual gifts."*

## Wednesday, Sep 14, 2022

### Cross purposes

Today, we celebrate the feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross, celebrating three historic events in early church history: the finding of the True Cross in the Holy Land in the early fourth century by Saint Helena, the mother of Constantine (himself a saint in the calendars of the Eastern Catholic Churches); the dedication of what would become the Church of the Holy Sepulchre that same year; and the restoration of the True Cross to Jerusalem after it was taken by the Persians in 614. The feast is most obvious in the Eastern Churches

(Catholic, Orthodox, and otherwise) and features small processions and veneration of a large cross during and after the liturgy. Make sure to pay special attention to the Passion of Christ today, regardless of your tradition!

FEAST OF THE EXALTATION OF THE HOLY CROSS

TODAY'S READINGS: Numbers 21:4b-9; Philippians 2:6-11; John 3:13-17 (638). *"He humbled himself, becoming obedient to death, even death on a cross. Because of this, God greatly exalted him."*

## Thursday, Sep 15, 2022

### Mary understands your pain

In scripture, when Jesus is presented in the temple, Simeon notes that Mary's heart will be pierced. Later when Jesus recognizes her presence at the foot of the cross as he is dying, Simeon's prediction is fulfilled. Mary's steadfast faith during the ordeal of the Crucifixion serves as a beacon for anyone who suffers. Because today is the Memorial of Our Lady of Sorrows, it's an appropriate moment to ask Mary—who understands pain so well—to pray for our suffering loved ones and all who are enduring great trials.

MEMORIAL OF OUR LADY OF SORROWS

TODAY'S READINGS: 1 Corinthians 15:1-11 (446); John 19:25-27 or Luke 2:33-35 (639). *"Standing by the cross of Jesus were his mother and his mother's sister, Mary the wife of Clopas, and Mary Magdalene."*

## Friday, Sep 16, 2022

### ¡Vivan las buenas noticias!

On Sept. 16, 1810, after being stymied in his efforts to promote economic advancement for his parishioners, Jesuit Father Miguel Hidalgo y Costilla stood in the town square of Dolores in New Spain and declared what became known as *El Grito de Dolores* ("The Cry of Dolores"): "Long live religion! Long live our Blessed Mother of Guadalupe! Long live America and death to bad government!" Thus, the Mexican War for Independence began. Today is a good day to continue the fight for economic justice. Consider beginning with morning Mass, for as Saint Cyprian wrote to his friend Pope Cornelius: "It is not only the weak but the strong who need defense . . . strengthening them for combat with the Body and Blood of Christ!"

MEMORIAL OF CORNELIUS, POPE, AND CYPRIAN, BISHOP, MARTYRS

TODAY'S READINGS: 1 Corinthians 15:12-20; Luke 8:1-3 (447). *"Jesus journeyed from one town and village to another, preaching and proclaiming the good news."*

## Saturday, Sep 17, 2022

### Worth the wait

To be named a saint, one must complete the official Roman canonization process, right? Well, not exactly. Today's saint, Hildegard of Bingen, was entered into the process four times. But all the lengthy examinations and documentations were never completed. So she remained beatified but not canonized for almost a thousand years! Yet, many popes, including John Paul II, referred to her as Saint Hildegard. Finally, in 2012, Benedict XVI promoted her to sainthood in a process called "equivalent canonization" that cuts through all the red tape. And he named her a doctor of the church to boot. Your faithful witness will be recognized—even if it takes a thousand years!

TODAY'S READINGS: 1 Corinthians 15:35-37, 42-49; Luke 8:4-15 (448). *"Knowledge of the mysteries of the Kingdom of God has been granted to you."*
