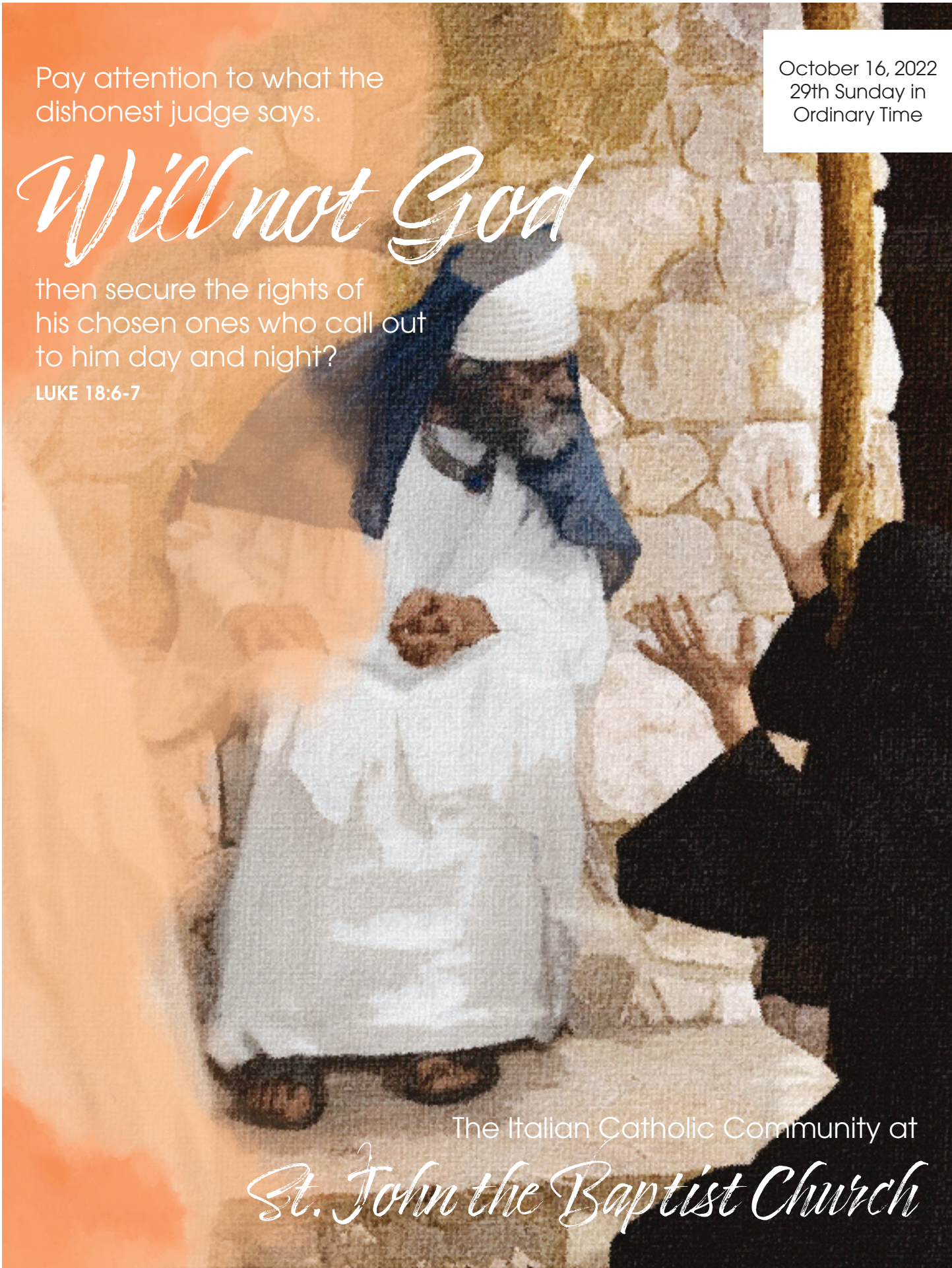

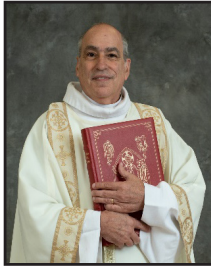

My Dear Parishioners of St. John the Baptist Church,

With this introductory letter, I would like to express my deepest thanks to our **Bishop Earl K. Fernandes** for entrusting me with the administration of this parish.

Since the **1st of October**, I was assigned to the **Sacred Heart Parish** and on **November 1st**, I will begin my work at **St. John the Baptist Church**. Many thanks to **Fr. Adam Streitenberger** and **Deacon Frank Iannarino** for their dedication and commitment in taking responsibility for these parishes during the last couple of years.

My name is Fr. Andrew Kozminski. I was born, grew up and was educated in **Poland**. In **1980**, I joined the **Congregation** of the **Society of the Catholic Apostolate**, known as **Pallottine Fathers and Brothers**. This is originally an **Italian Order** present in **Poland** since **1907**. Our founder - **Saint Vincent Pallotti (1795-1850)**, was a priest from **Rome, Italy**. (*From his last name we are being called **Pallottines**.*)

In the entire world there are **406** communities of the **Pallottines**, **1720** priests and **106** brothers, and with our young members in formation there are about **3,000** of us. In **1988**, I was ordained a priest. The first year of my priesthood, I worked in **Poland** and then I began my missionary journey throughout the world.

These are the countries I worked in: **Australia, Papua New Guinea, Scotland, and United States**. I came to this country a couple of days before the tragic of **9/11/2001**. I was assigned first to **Buffalo NY, Sarasota FL**, then returned to **Buffalo NY** and two years ago, I came to **Columbus**. My assignment here was **St. Christopher Parish in Grandview**.

I am looking with great excitement to serve you and work with you, I have a lot of fears, knowing that the process we are going through in our diocese (**Real Presence, Real Future**) will bring us a lot of changes and challenges. With this in mind, I ask you to be very patient with me and please support me with your prayers. We – together – are responsible for bringing the burning torch of our faith and love of **God** to a new generation.

Let our faith burn brightly, that many can see it, be inspired by it, and join us in this special commitment. As **St. Vincent Pallotti** used the words of **St. Paul the Apostle** as his life motto, let us make it our own:

“The love of Christ urges us!” (2 Cor 5:14)

"**Ask and you shall receive,**" not what you wanted, but what **God** knew you needed. "**Seek and you shall find,**" not the easy way which you thought you deserved, but the harder way which would make you more deserving of heaven. "**Knock and it shall be opened unto you,**" not the door you were standing at, which would have delayed or endangered your progress, but the door further down the street where refreshment and new courage to continue were awaiting you.

The United Nations, which declared today Poverty Eradication Day, proposed that the world work to "build forward," which "means not only that no one is left behind, but that people living in poverty are actively encouraged and supported to be in the front." The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches that "those who are oppressed by poverty are the object of a preferential love on the part of the Church which, since her origin and in spite of the failings of many of her members, has not ceased to work for their relief, defense, and liberation through numerous works of charity which remain indispensable always and everywhere." Do your part to create a society where the needs of the poor are always considered first.

Luke's writing is famous for honoring the full humanity of everyone Jesus encountered. How can you be a person who does the same?

Healing past wrongs is a mission of love

Today the church celebrates the feast of the North American Martyrs, a group of eight French Jesuit missionaries killed in the 17th century by members of the Mohawk people in Canada. One of the best-known martyrs is Saint Isaac Jogues, who after originally being ransomed by Dutch colonists—including a Protestant pastor—in 1642, was one of two Jesuits who returned to the Mohawk region in an (unsuccessful) attempt to broker peace. As relations between the church hierarchy and First Nations people remain fraught, and following Pope Francis' recent

visit to Canada to apologize for injustices at the hands of Catholics, may the saints we remember today inspire us to serve without prejudice or fear.

We all struggle at times

Saint Paul of the Cross became the founder of the Passionists, a worldwide religious community. In his day (the 1700s) he was a famous preacher who drew large crowds. But as a young man still considering his path in life, he was beset with doubts: "The very sound of the church bells became hateful to me," he wrote about this period. His life reminds us that confusion and doubt have long affected the faithful. If you've experienced this kind of anguish, you are not alone. "Lord, I believe. Help my unbelief," (Mark 9:23) is a prayer many turn to.

Right relationship

Following Jesus the Christ means living in right relationship—with others, with the Earth and all God's creatures, and perhaps most important, with your own self. The backbone of right relationships is love. Such love, Saint Thomas Aquinas says, is "willing the good of the other." For Catholics, this idea of right relationship has two key components. First, it means upholding the dignity of all persons, especially when we encounter differences and conflict. Second, it means working for justice. Justice is something we can practice daily in our choices of how we live and how we treat others. It also means being aware of and active in transforming unjust structures and institutions. What helps you nurture right relationships?

TODAY'S READINGS: Ephesians 4:1-6; Luke 12:54-59 (477). *"Why do you not judge for yourselves what is right?"*

Loss leads to life

Pope Saint John Paul II, canonized in 2011, was revered for his many accomplishments during his long pontificate. What is less well known about the beloved pontiff is that he experienced tremendous loss early in life. The future pope lost his mother when he was only 9, his eldest brother when he was 12, and his father when he was just 21. Perhaps this is why Saint John Paul II made the "culture of life" a focus on his pontificate: the "church counters the culture of death with the culture of life," he said as he advocated for all life issues, in statements such as this: "May the death penalty, an unworthy punishment still used in some countries, be abolished throughout the world." Let loss lead to life.
