Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

This **Sunday**, we begin a new liturgical year. The liturgy invites us to come to the house of **God**, so that **God** may teach us His ways and help us to walk in His light.

Beginning the **Church's** liturgical year, **Advent (from, "ad-venire" in Latin or "to come to")** is the season encompassing the **four Sundays (and weekdays)** leading up to the celebration of **Christmas**.

The **Advent** season is a time of **preparation** that directs our hearts and minds to **Christ's** second coming at the end of time and to the anniversary of **Our Lord's birth on Christmas**. From the earliest days of the **Church**, people have been fascinated by **Jesus'** promise to come back. But the Scripture readings during **Advent** tell us not to waste our time with predictions. **Advent** is not about speculation. Our **Advent** readings call us to be alert and ready, not weighed down and distracted by the cares of this world (**Lk 21:34-36**).

With the author of the **Psalm 24**, we pray: "**Lord**, make me know your ways. **Lord**, teach me your paths. Make me walk in your truth and teach me, for you are **God** my **Savior**."

Like **Lent**, the liturgical color for **Advent** is purple since both are seasons that prepare us for great feast days.

Advent also includes an element of penance in the sense of preparing, quieting, and disciplining our hearts for the full joy of **Christmas**.

Every **Sunday**, I am available – one hour before **Mass** in the confessional. Please use the **Sacrament of God's love** and mercy as a special way of preparation – cleansing of your soul for the great feast of **Christmas**.

Once in the past, **Jesus** was born in the stable, and now He would like to be reborn in our clean and shining hearts.

"Let us go forth with a clean heart to receive the supreme **King**, for He is to come, and He will not delay," as we read among the **Advent Antiphons of the Liturgy**.

Have a blessed Advent.

Keep smiling and be positive – God loves you!

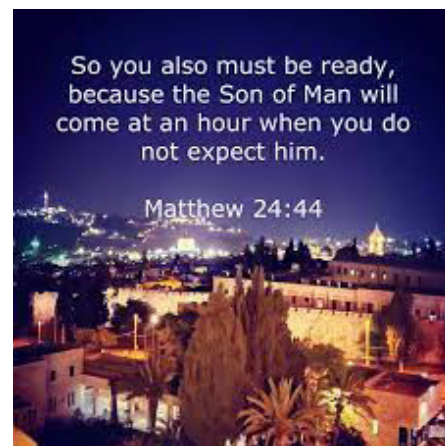
The Beauty of the Advent Wreath: The **Advent Wreath** is a long-standing **Christmas** tradition, adding beauty and light to the season. The wreath is a circle, without beginning or end, symbolizes our participation in **God's** plan of salvation, and our hope to share eternal life in the **Kingdom of Heaven.**

The traditional wreath is made from fresh, natural materials, because **Christ** came to give us new life through **His** passion, death, and **Resurrection.** There are **three purple** or **white** candles, symbolizing **penance, preparation,** and **sacrifice.** The **pink** or **rose-colored** candle highlights the **Third Sunday of Advent,** when we rejoice because our preparation is now halfway finished. The light itself represents **Christ.** The progression of lighting candles shows our increasing readiness to meet our **Lord.**

First Sunday of Advent: For **Catholics,** the new **Liturgical Year** commences with the first **Sunday of Advent.** In this new liturgical year, the **Church** not only wishes to mark the beginning of a renewed commitment to the faith by all those who follow **Christ, the Lord.** This time of prayer and path of penance that is so powerful, rich, and intense endeavors to give us a renewed impetus to truly welcome the message of the **Christ.** The entire **Liturgy of the Advent Season** will spur us to an awakening in our **Christian life.**

Today's Gospel: Today's **Gospel** comes from **Matthew,** and it asks us this: Are you awake? Spiritually speaking? As we begin the liturgical season of **Advent,** we are given the future coming of the **Son of God** to ponder. As this passage goes on, **Jesus says,** "Therefore, stay awake! For you do not know on which day your **Lord will come.**" Reflect, today, upon how ready you are for the final coming of **Christ** at the end of time. Are you ready if **Christ** were to come today? If not, understand that a lack of preparedness for the final coming also means a lack of preparedness to celebrate **His** first coming at **Christmas** long ago, as well as **His** daily comings by grace. Prepare today. Do not wait. If you do, **God** will daily transform you in ways that are glorious beyond comprehension.

But for believers, the season beginning today is really about anticipation and Incarnation, light illuminating the darkness, and God coming near. We know what time it is. Make this Advent a genuine celebration of hope.

TODAY'S READINGS: Isaiah 2:1-5; Romans 13:11-14; Matthew 24:37-44 (1). "You know the time; it is the hour now for you to awake from sleep."

Monday, Nov 28, 2022**Time to get ready!**

With the Thanksgiving holiday weekend wrapped up, Catholics yesterday began the Advent journey to Christmas. The word *advent* comes from Latin for "to come." All the days from now until the celebration of the birth of Jesus are preparation for his coming. Preparation in this case means remembering to be ready with a spirit of both penance and joy. Did you set out an Advent wreath on your dinner table yesterday? For many, it's the first of many Christmas decorations to come out—with festooned trees not far behind. The wreath is more than just a pretty adornment but also a daily reminder to pray as you count down each week with a new candle. Start the season out right by blessing your wreath with a prayer.

TODAY'S READINGS: Isaiah 4:2-6; Matthew 8:5-11 (175). "Amen, I say to you, in no one in Israel have I found such faith."

Tuesday, Nov 29, 2022**Listen with the ear of a child**

"Advent is not a time to declare, but to listen, to listen to whatever God may want to tell us through the singing of the stars, the quickening of a baby, the gallantry of a dying man," wrote Christian writer Madeleine L'Engle, born this day in 1918. L'Engle is especially known for her children's books, including *A Wrinkle in Time*, which won the 1963 Newberry Medal. This Advent, consider what it might be like to imitate the Christ Child instead of the adult Jesus. As *A Wrinkle in Time* tells us: "To love is to be vulnerable; and it is only in vulnerability and risk—not safety and security—that we overcome darkness."

TODAY'S READINGS: Isaiah 11:1-10; Luke 10:21-24 (176). "Although you have hidden these things from the wise and the learned you have revealed them to the childlike."

Wednesday, Nov 30, 2022**Be first to follow the Lord**

It's no coincidence that Saint Andrew the Apostle is linked to Advent (which traditionally begins on the Sunday closest to his feast day). In Eastern Christianity he is known as *protokletos*, "first called," because it was Andrew, who had been a disciple of John the Baptist, who persuaded his brother Simon (whom we know as Peter) to follow Jesus with his words, "We have found the

Messiah!" Andrew also has a devotion linked to Advent, known as the Saint Andrew Novena. Try it out and see if it supports and deepens your living out your own call.

Thursday, Dec 01, 2022**Build on higher ground**

Anyone who has followed the news over the past year has seen more images than ever of people coping with floods. Families waiting on rooftops, people stuffed in boats, neighbors wading through murky water. Jesus constantly used images to make his point, including the image of discipleship as a solid house that stands firm during storms and floods. "Be faithful in small things because it is in them that your strength lies," Saint Teresa of Calcutta once said. Are you building a strong, flood-proof house in the small things you do each day?

TODAY'S READINGS: Isaiah 26:1-6; Matthew 7:21, 24-27 (178).

"Everyone who listens to these words of mine and acts on them will be like a wise man who built his house on rock."

Friday, Dec 02, 2022**Walk with each other**

Today, the church remembers martyrs Jean Donovan, Maura Clarke, Dorothy Kazel, and Ita Ford, brutally murdered for standing with the poor in war-torn El Salvador in 1980. Their witness still speaks profoundly to us today as we encounter our own wars, violence, and suffering, especially among the most vulnerable. And still, we struggle to know what to do. Let us take courage as we ponder the questions posed by Ita Ford in 1977: "Am I willing to suffer with the people here, the suffering of the powerless? Can I say to my neighbors, 'I have no solution to this situation. I don't know the answers, but I will walk with you, search with you, be with you?'"

TODAY'S READINGS: Isaiah 29:17-24; Matthew 9:27-31 (179). "Let it be done for you according to your faith."

Saturday, Dec 03, 2022**Missionizing begins at home**

Many of the practices of the great "missionizing projects" of centuries past are seen as problematic in our age, with its greater sensibility of the rights of indigenous peoples to worship freely as they wish. So, while the legacy of one of the patrons of foreign missions, Saint Francis Xavier, is a mixed one, it is significant to note that he always provided for ongoing pastoral care of the communities he missionized and also advocated for an educated native clergy (rather than foreign-born leadership). None of us acts with perfect justice, but each of us finds oneself living in a unique historical moment, called upon to help church and society live up to the best and most noble qualities of our tradition.

TODAY'S READINGS: Isaiah 30:19-21, 23-26; Matthew 9:35—10:1, 5a, 6-8 (180). "At the sight of the crowds, his heart was moved with pity for them because they were troubled and abandoned, like sheep without a shepherd."
