#### Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Last **Wednesday**, with traditional distribution of the ashes, we entered the **Holy Season of Lent**. This time I would like to present to you – a spiritual reflection by **St. Vincent Pallotti** entitled: "**The Infinite Love and Mercy of Jesus Christ in the Desert.**"

Enlightened by faith. I must recall that Our Lord Jesus Christ. after humbling **Himself** by the **Baptism** of **Penance**, went to the desert. For forty days and nights He prayed and fasted; He even permitted **Himself** to be tempted **three** times by our common enemy, the devil. But **He** overcame the temptations. He permitted this for all our sake, out of **His** infinite love and mercy, although He knew how little we would profit from it, and how much we would abuse it, by acting contrary to His will. He nevertheless condescended to teach us the practice of solitude, in order to speak alone to God about the business of our eternal salvation. He taught us how to pray in order to profit efficaciously by this ineffable means of obtaining all graces. He taught us how to fast in order to keep our passions and our flesh mortified. Finally, with **His** victory over temptations of the devil, **He** taught us how to overcome the temptations of our spiritual enemies, so that we may persevere in the work of sanctifying our souls, living images of God. In this way, we will never do anything to destroy our soul. Jesus did this not only as an example to us, but also in order to grant us the grace of imitating Him in everything. Thus, all the infinite merits of His retreat, prayer, fast, and victories over the devil, would be ours.

My Jesus, my most loving first-born brother, true God and true man, eternal God, infinite, immense, incomprehensible, infinite love and mercy. Only You with the Father and the Holy Spirit can enlighten us, so to that we may know Your infinite love and mercy, manifested in Your solitude, prayer, and fast, and Your victories over the devil in the desert. You can help us with your grace to profit from it as You wish. Not because You need this, but because of our great necessity. Allow us, therefore, to perform our duties well, so that we may perfect our soul, a living image of You, and thus atone for the excesses of our ingratitude and impiety... Amen.

#### **AROUND US**

The Holy Father's Intention for the Month of February 2023: For Parishes: We pray that parishes, placing communion at the center, may increasingly become communities of faith, fraternity and welcome towards those most in need.

Liturgical Calendar: The month of February is dedicated to the Holy Family. The special devotion, which proposes the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph as the model of virtue of all Christian households, began in the 17th century. The first 3/12 weeks of February fall during the liturgical season known as Ordinary Time which is represented by the liturgical color green. The remaining days of **February** are the beginning of **Lent**. The liturgical color changes to violet or purple.

CRS Rice Bowl is a Lenten faith formation program for use in parishes, schools, religious education programs and by families and individuals in the home. CRS Rice Bowl serves the poorest among us through Catholic Relief Services' work in over 100 countries. During this pandemic year, over \$120,000.00 was used to support diocesan local hunger programs. This year's CRS Rice Bowl donations are critical for these grants to continue as the fund's account is nearly depleted. Please support CRS Rice Bowl during Lent. Bowls are located on the tables at the entrance to the Church.

Dispensation for Saint Patrick's Day: The obligation to abstain from meat on the Fridays of Lent is an important element of the Church's observance of the penitential nature of this holy season. This year, March 17, the Friday of the Third Week of Lent, corresponds with Saint Patrick's Day, traditionally an occasion for joy-filled celebrations in this diocese, especially among those of Irish heritage. Bishop Fernandes, taking into consideration both past practice and present circumstances, has granted to the faithful of the Diocese of Columbus, as well as to any visitors or travelers who may be physically present within the territory of this diocese, a dispensation from the obligation of abstinence from meat on March 17, 2023, provided that the member of the faithful taking advantage of this dispensation, undertakes one of the following works: 1) makes a pilgrimage or visit to any church in the Diocese of Columbus named in honor of St. Patrick (Columbus, London, Junction City); 2) assists at Mass at any church, chapel, or oratory on March 17; 3) prays the "Breastplate of St. Patrick," attributed to St. Patrick; 4) engages in some pious devotion such as the Rosary, the Stations of the Cross, or Eucharistic Adoration; or 5) performs an act of comparable penance (such as abstinence from meat) on some other occasion during the Third Week of Lent.

Spring Clean Up: St. Joseph, Resurrection, Holy Cross, and Mt. Calvary Catholic Cemeteries will begin removing wintertime decorations beginning March 1st, weather permitting. Families are advised to remove any personal keepsakes they wish to retain as soon as possible.

Church Regulations Regarding Fasting and Abstinence during Lent: Abstinence from meat (beast or fowl) is to be observed by all Catholics fourteen years and older on Ash Wednesday and on all Fridays of Lent. This obligation prohibits the eating of meat, but not eggs, milk products or condiments of any kind, even though made from animal fat. The law of fasting on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday applies to all Catholics from age 18 through age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. Those who are ill or pregnant may be dispensed from their obligation.



t's Fish Fry Time: One of the great parts of en en Lent is the return of that wonderful Catholic institution, the Friday Fish Fry. The Fish Fry is a chance to not only make a personal sacrifice, but also streghen your bond with your spiritual

community by joining other Catholics at these weekly gatherings.

<u>Today's Gospel: Matthew 4:1-11:</u> The Gospel is from St. Matthew 4:1-11. This incident in our Lord's life, His forty days and nights of fasting followed by temptations, has been chosen as a reading for this first Sunday of Lent for our edification and encouragement. Lent is a period of preparation for the central Christian events of Good Friday and Easter Sunday. Christ, the Son of God in human nature, died the excruciating death of crucifixion on Good Friday, because of the sins of the human race. By this supreme act of obedience to his heavenly Father, He made atonement for all our disobediences and set us free from the slavery of Satan and of sin. In His resurrection, His human nature was glorified by **God** the **Father**, and in that glorification, we are all offered a share and given the right to an eternal life of glory, if we follow Christ faithfully in this life. -Excerpted from The Sunday Readings by Fr. The prayer book of Gregory of Narek is a fixture in religious Armenian homes, second only to the Bible, and is considered a masterpiece of Christian spiritual literature. #### Get on board for justice

Today marks the 98th death anniversary of Homer Plessy, the man who attempted to end segregation with his legendary ride on a whites-only streetcar in New Orleans in 1892. His efforts were unsuccessful, and the following seven decades of U.S. jurisprudence included segregation as a bedrock feature. Plessy, however, is much less heralded for the fact that he was a man of faith, a black Catholic whose famous ride was organized by an interracial activist group known as the Comité des Citoyens (Citizens' Committee). Their holy disobedience was one of the first Catholic-led efforts against the

developing hierarchy of racism in the formerly French and Spanish regions of the Deep South. May the courage of Plessy and his allies be of use to us today as we continue the march toward justice.

Saint Katharine Drexel was born in Philadelphia in 1858 to a wealthy family. The Drexels had a reputation for generosity, reportedly opening their home several days a week to feed and care for people in need. They also made time every day to pray together. During a trip to Europe as a young woman, Katharine was able to have an audience with Pope Leo XIII. She asked the Holy Father to send missionaries to Wyoming. He answered, "Why don't you go?" Not long after, Katharine stunned society by leaving behind her privileged life to dedicate herself to religious life. She worked to improve living conditions and educational opportunities for African Americans and Native Americans. She left a legacy far greater than her family fortune.

Lenten inspiration can come from anywhere—from scripture to Instagram, from saints to young people. While not a Bible figure or social media influencer, 15th-century Casimir of Poland happens to fit the categories of both saint and young person. Saint Casimir was a prince who was under intense pressure from his family and country to take a leading role in government and politics. But Casimir felt called to focus on prayer, study, and care for people in need. Although he had to contend with some very disappointed people, he stood firm in his decision to follow his calling. Disease cut short his life at the tender age of 25, but his example can inspire us to live out our calling and thus help fulfill his.
