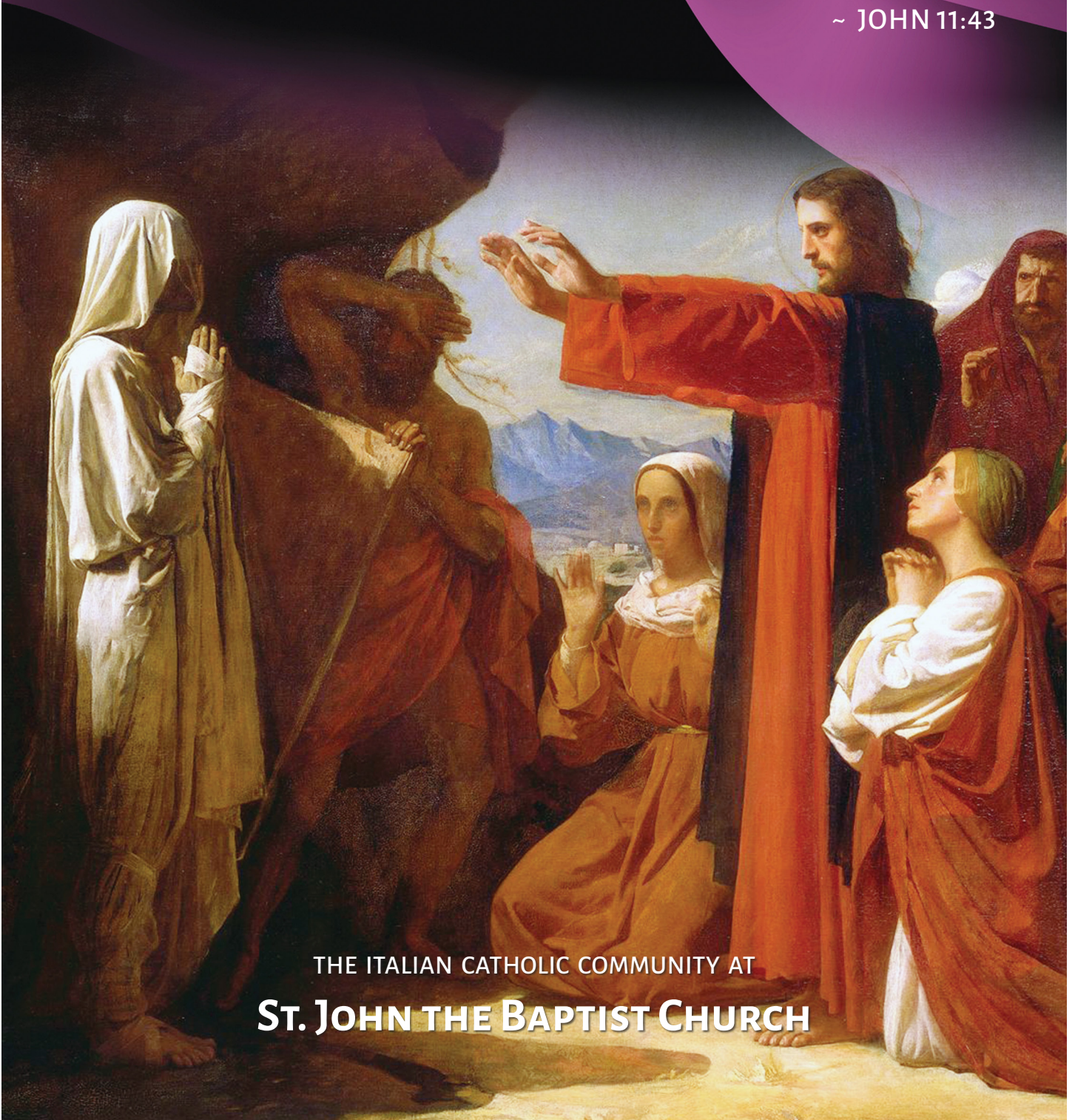

ST. JOHN THE BAPTIST

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

In today's Gospel, we see a scene with which all of us are familiar, namely people weeping over the death of a loved one (**Lazarus**). **Jesus** is at the center of that scene. He is the one who gives hope to those who are surrounded by the shadow of death.

St. John's main aim is to arouse faith in **Jesus** and to show the effects of faith in **Him**.

"Lazarus is dead; and for your sake I am glad I was not there because now you will believe." And the story ends with the words: **"Many of the Jews who had come to visit Mary and had seen what He did believed in Him."**

Martha is presented as a model of faith. In defiance of the evidence, she makes a wonderful profession of faith: **"I believe that you are the Christ, the Son of God, the one who was to come into the world."**

Jesus is the source of life, not just physical life, but the undying life of **God**. This new life is not a mere future hope, but a present reality which physical death, despite appearances, does not negate. The key words in the story are: **"I am the resurrection and the life."** The delay in coming to **Martha** and **Mary**, and the fact that **Lazarus** has been dead for **four** days, serve to underline the point the evangelist is making, namely, that **Jesus** is the **Master** of life and death.

Jesus is God.

God is life, and the source of life.

God is love, and the source of love.

Do you believe that?

Tell your answer now.

Be positive, keep smiling, God loves you!

The Holy Father's Intentions for the Month of March 2023: We pray for those who have suffered harm from members of the Church; may they find within the Church herself a concrete response to their pain and suffering.

Liturgical Calendar: The entire month of **March** falls during the liturgical season of **Lent** which is represented by the liturgical color violet or purple – a symbol of penance, mortification and the sorrow of a contrite heart. All saint days that are usually **Memorials** are shifted to **Optional Memorials** during the season of **Lent**.

To strengthen and enrich the families of our diocese, the **Marriage and Family Life Office** will be introducing **Family Month**, from **Mother's Day** to **Father's Day**, **May 14 to June 18**. The **Marriage and Family Life Office** will have more details and resources in the coming weeks.

**Church Regulations Regarding Fasting and Abstinence during Lent:**

This obligation prohibits the eating of meat, but not eggs, milk products or condiments of any kind, even though made from animal fat.

The law of fasting on **Ash Wednesday** and **Good Friday** applies to all **Catholics from age 18 through age 59**. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. Those who are ill or pregnant may be dispensed from their obligation.



It's fish Fry time: One of the great parts of Lent is the return of that wonderful Catholic institution, the Friday Fish Fry. The Fish Fry is a chance to not only make a personal sacrifice,

but also strengthen your bond with your spiritual community by joining other Catholics at these weekly gatherings.

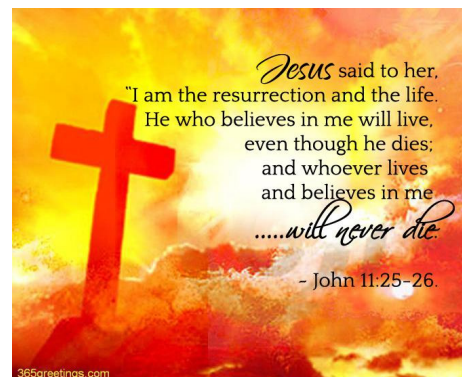
Lenten Practices: Prayer, fasting and almsgiving are the three pillars of **Lenten** practices. **Prayer** is our necessary communication with **God**, reminding us of our very intimate relationship with **God**, our creator. **Fasting** can help us curb our body's appetites and put our soul in control. **Fasting** does not have to be limited to avoiding food. We can also fast from different forms of entertainment and our over-reliance on the smartphone. **Lent** can be an opportunity to give up these forms of escape and replace them with some good spiritual reading. **Almsgiving** is the third pillar. When we give alms, we are reminded that the monetary resources that we have are the result of **God's** blessings which are meant to be shared, especially with the poor. ~ **Father Kitzmiller**

The Fifth Sunday of Lent: Previously called "**Passion Sunday**," this **Fifth Sunday of Lent** marks the beginning of **Passiontide**, a deeper time of **Lent**. This is the third **Sunday** of the **scrutinies** for the preparation of adult converts, and the final **Sunday of Lent** before the beginning of **Holy Week**. The **Liturgy of the Word** of this day speaks of re-creation, Resurrection, and new life. Today, the option of covering of sacred images is practiced.

Today's Gospel: The **Gospel** reading from **John 11:1-45**, opens with a scene of unprecedented sorrow. **The Lord Jesus** receives the message from the sisters of **Lazarus** who, when confronted with the gravity of his condition, tried the only thing possible, they turned to the **Lord**. It is the cry of each one of us who would like their loved ones to live forever without ever leaving us. Upon **Jesus'** arrival in **Bethany**, **Mary**, then her sister, **Martha**, and behind them all the **Jews** who were united with them, converge on **Jesus** with the certainty that if there was a response to their sorrow it would come from **Him**. Sharing our existence, **Jesus** had loved us with a supreme passion, **He** was able to be moved by those who were linked to **Him** by ties of the most profound friendship, who understood that it could not be anything but **God's** presence amongst them. "**I am the Resurrection and the life; whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die. Do you believe this?**" **She said to him, "Yes, Lord. I have come to believe that you are the Messiah, the Son of God, the one who is coming into the world."** (Jn 11:25-27) **Christ** then performed the great miracle of **Lazarus'** resurrection. It was **Martha and Mary's** faith, even when confronted with **Lazarus'** death that gave rise to the extraordinary miracle worked by **Christ**.

Most Holy Mary, the mother of the Risen One, give us the grace to look towards and live the light of this extraordinary reality – the promise of Resurrection in Christ. Amen.

Sunday, Mar 26, 2023**Hints of resurrection**

While the Hebrew scripture written before Jesus lived doesn't explicitly speak of resurrection in the same way it is spoken of after Jesus is raised from the dead, there are certainly rumors and whispers. Perhaps the most explicit references are in chapter 37 of Ezekiel, where God, working through the prophet, raises a valley of dry bones to new life and promises to restore them to the promised land after their captivity in Babylon centuries before Christ. Saint Jerome called the vision of the valley of bones a "simile" of the Resurrection to come. There's hope for these old bones yet!

Monday, Mar 27, 2023**A profile in courage**

In the last week of Women's History Month, here's another Catholic woman who made history: Servant of God Catherine de Hueck Doherty (1896-1985). Born wealthy in Russia, she escaped the Russian Revolution and fled to Canada. During the Great Depression, she founded Friendship House, a Catholic outreach movement to serve the poor and promote interracial friendship—a movement that started in Toronto and spread to Harlem, Chicago, Washington D.C., and Portland, Oregon. As a nation and a world community, we face trials comparable to the ones Doherty faced. She responded with courage, generosity, love, and gospel witness. Let us do the same!

Tuesday, Mar 28, 2023**'Tis a gift to be simple**

Happy birthday to Saint John Neumann today—nicknamed the "little bishop" not only for his stature but for the humility that came from his Redemptorist vow of poverty, which he honored even after becoming bishop of Philadelphia. Neumann's simplicity invites rich reflection for Lent. "Our great mistake is that we allow ourselves to be deceived by the spirit of worldly shrewdness, the desire for fame, and the love of comfort," he wrote to a fellow priest. "The principles of faith fade out of our hearts in proportion as we allow the principles of the world to come in." Simplify your life to make more room for what feeds your faith.

TODAY'S READINGS: Numbers 21:4-9; John 8:21-30 (252). *"You belong to this world, but I do not belong to this world."*

Wednesday, Mar 29, 2023**Redemption is at hand**

Though they, along with other ancient societies, engaged in some forms of household slavery, Jews as a general rule frowned upon the institution. Slaves who were not Jewish were to be offered conversion to Judaism and if they became Jews, immediately freed. Jews were also required to redeem Jewish slaves from non-Jewish owners. Memory of their own captivity in Egypt and Babylonia loomed large, and they resented Jesus promising to free them. But when Jesus spoke of the truth setting Jews free, he was talking about another kind of enslavement, the kind we all fall

into through unskillful actions, behaviors, habits, compulsions. Look honestly at what might be restricting your inner freedom and ask Jesus to redeem you.

TODAY'S READINGS: Daniel 3:14-20, 91-92, 95; John 8:31-42 (253). *"We are descendants of Abraham and have never been enslaved to anyone. How can you say, 'You will become free'?"*

Thursday, Mar 30, 2023**Help your unbelief**

Can a believer doubt? It can be a relief to learn that a whole school of thought among Catholic theologians asserts that doubt, while seemingly corrosive, can actually bolster faith in the end. Doubt can lead to exploration, which often leads to better understanding, greater clarity, or sometimes simply a willingness to not know, to live without all questions fully answered, leaning into religious practice with an open heart. Most would call that an adult faith. What questions nag at you? Doubt, dig, and remain open to God.

Friday, Mar 31, 2023**Miles to go**

Women's History Month concludes today, but the work of ensuring the rights of women continues. In a November 2022 press conference, Pope Francis acknowledged that more work needs to be done. "We have to tell the truth," the pope said. "The fight for women's rights is an ongoing fight." This includes equality in public life and also "equality of opportunities." How might we each open a door of opportunity for women in our own families, parishes, neighborhoods, schools, or offices?

LENTEN WEEKDAY; DAY OF ABSTINENCE

TODAY'S READINGS: Jeremiah 20:10-13; John 10:31-42 (255). *"If I do not perform my Father's works, do not believe me; but if I perform them, even if you do not believe me, believe the works."*

Saturday, Apr 01, 2023**A well-traveled pilgrim helped shape Holy Week**

Holy Week begins tomorrow. It's in the description of Jesus' last week—immediately ahead of his death and Resurrection—that all four gospels resemble each other the most. The church's liturgical celebration of Holy Week, however, was a late development. Originally, Christians had only a single *Pascha* liturgy to observe Jesus' suffering, death, and Resurrection. Specific Holy Week liturgies for Palm Sunday, Holy Thursday, and Good Friday grew from individual shrines in Jerusalem where each event occurred. Thanks to a detailed travel journal, written in 383 by a remarkable woman pilgrim to the Holy Land named Egeria, these liturgies began to take shape. As Holy Week begins, let's not only honor the women at the empty tomb but the woman who helped define Holy Week.
