ST. JOHN THE BAPTIST*Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,***Feast of the Divine Mercy****Divine Mercy Sunday: Celebrating God's Unconditional Love and Forgiveness**

The **Second Sunday of Easter**, which falls on the **Sunday** after **Easter Sunday**, is a special day of celebration for **Catholics** all over the world. On this day, **Catholics** celebrate **Divine Mercy Sunday**, a day dedicated to reflecting on **God's** infinite mercy and love for all people. **Divine Mercy Sunday** was officially declared by **Pope John Paul II** in the year **2000** at the canonization of **St. Faustina Kowalska**, a **Polish** nun who received visions from **Jesus** and is considered the **Apostle of Divine Mercy**.

The **Image of Divine Mercy** was one of the most important of the many visions and messages that **Jesus** gave to **St. Faustina**. In this vision, **Jesus** appeared to her while dressed in white, with red and white light beams emanating from **His** heart. He told her that **He** wanted the **Image** to be venerated publicly so that every soul may know about it. **Jesus** also said that **He** desired the **Feast of Mercy** to be a refuge and shelter for all souls, especially for poor sinners. **Jesus** promised complete forgiveness of sins to those who partake of Communion and go to **Confession** on the **Feast of Mercy**, according to **St. Faustina's** diary.

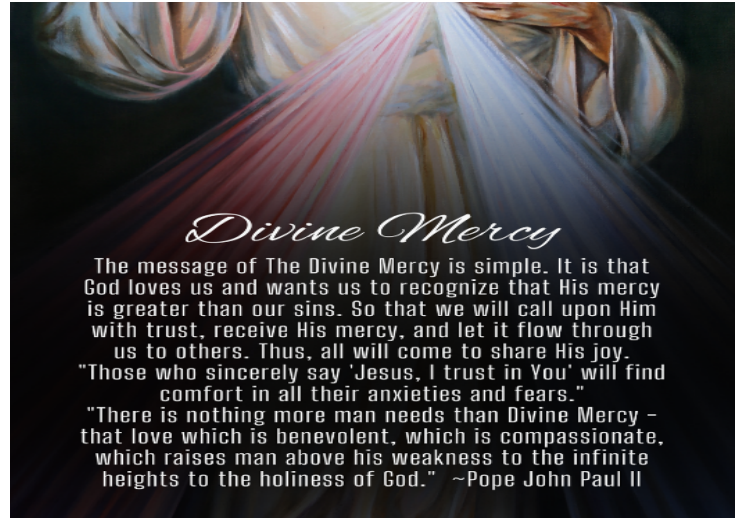
The **Image of Divine Mercy** holds great significance for **Catholics** as it is a reminder of **God's** infinite love and mercy for all people. **Pope John Paul II** spoke about the Image in his homily for **St. Faustina's** canonization, where he said that the two rays of light shining from **Jesus'** heart represent blood and water. The blood recalls **Jesus'** sacrifice on the **Cross** and the gift of the **Eucharist**, while the water represents **Baptism** and the gift of the **Holy Spirit**. Together, these rays symbolize the complete forgiveness and renewal that comes from **God's** love and mercy.

Divine Mercy Sunday is a day of celebration and reflection for **Catholics** worldwide. On this day, they are encouraged to attend **Mass**, receive Communion, and go to **Confession**. Through these acts, they receive **God's** mercy and forgiveness and are renewed in their faith. **Divine Mercy Sunday** is also an opportunity for **Catholics** to reflect on their own lives and consider how they can extend **God's** mercy and love to others.

In a world filled with pain, suffering, and sin, **Divine Mercy Sunday** offers hope and a reminder that **God's** love and mercy are always available to those who seek them. It is a day to celebrate the unconditional love and forgiveness of **God** and to reflect on how we can extend that same love and forgiveness to others in our lives. As **Pope John Paul II** once said, "**Mercy is the ultimate and supreme act by which God comes to meet us.**" On **Divine Mercy Sunday**, **Catholics** celebrate this ultimate act of love and are reminded that they, too, can be instruments of **God's** mercy in the world.

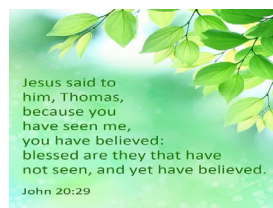

Today's Gospel: The **Gospel** is taken from **John 20:19-31.** Last **Sunday's** **Gospel**, also taken from **St. John**, described the first hint at the Resurrection which the **Apostles** received. **Peter and John** were beginning to believe. But the others were skeptical, the two disciples on the way to Emmaus paid no heed to the women's story, and **Thomas** refused to believe the testimony of the other ten, even when the appearance of our **Lord** had convinced them. Their slowness of faith had its value for the future **Church** and for all of us. If they had been expecting the Resurrection, and anxiously looking forward to it, people could say that they imagined it, that they persuaded themselves it had happened. The conviction that it could not happen, could not be removed from their minds except by impressive evidence. We can thank the **Apostles** and especially **Thomas**, the last to give in, that our faith in the Resurrection and divine glorification of **Christ** is that much the stronger. Our **Christianity** spread rapidly to the then known world and is still spreading because its author was none other than **Christ “our Lord and our God.”** How prophetic were the words of **Gamaliel** at the meeting of the **Sanhedrin** which tried to prevent the **Apostles** from preaching the new **Christian** faith: **“If this plan or work is of men, it will be overthrown; but if it is of God, you will not be able to overthrow it” (Acts 5:38-39).** – Excerpted from **The Sunday Readings, Cycle A,** by **Fr. Sunday, Apr 16, 2023**Put disappointments behind**

Learn a lesson from the experience of the apostle we've come to know as "doubting Thomas." Insisting that our expectations be met is often the path to disillusionment and heartbreak. The way to peace is another route entirely. As Saint John Chrysostom taught, "So you want peace of heart? Then do not seek health, nor wealth, nor fame, nor power, nor luxury. Seek wisdom in God's sight, stick to the virtues, and nothing will be able to make you sad." Start by cultivating the seven big virtues: faith, hope, love, prudence, temperance, courage, and justice. And leave disappointment in the rearview mirror.

Monday, Apr 17, 2023**Reborn and renewed**

Are Catholics "born again"? Yes, when we are baptized. In Baptism, we die with Christ, in that all sins are purified, and are reborn as children of God. Once done, it need not and cannot be repeated because by Baptism we are incorporated into Christ, configured to Christ, and sealed forever with the "indelible spiritual mark" of belonging to Christ. Catholics can, however, renew baptismal vows—and often do at Mass, especially during the Easter season, including the Easter Vigil Mass. Cherish this opportunity to restate your promises, profess your faith, and strengthen your commitment to Christ and church once again.

And, as the church instructs in its 1984 document on liberation theology, the "most radical form of slavery is slavery to sin." Reflect on God's activity in your own life, especially during times that you were stuck or caught in a

destructive pattern. God created us free and longs to see us free. Whatever fetters might have you tied down or wrestling in the dark at the moment, know that you can turn to God for release.

Liberation is what God loves to bring!
