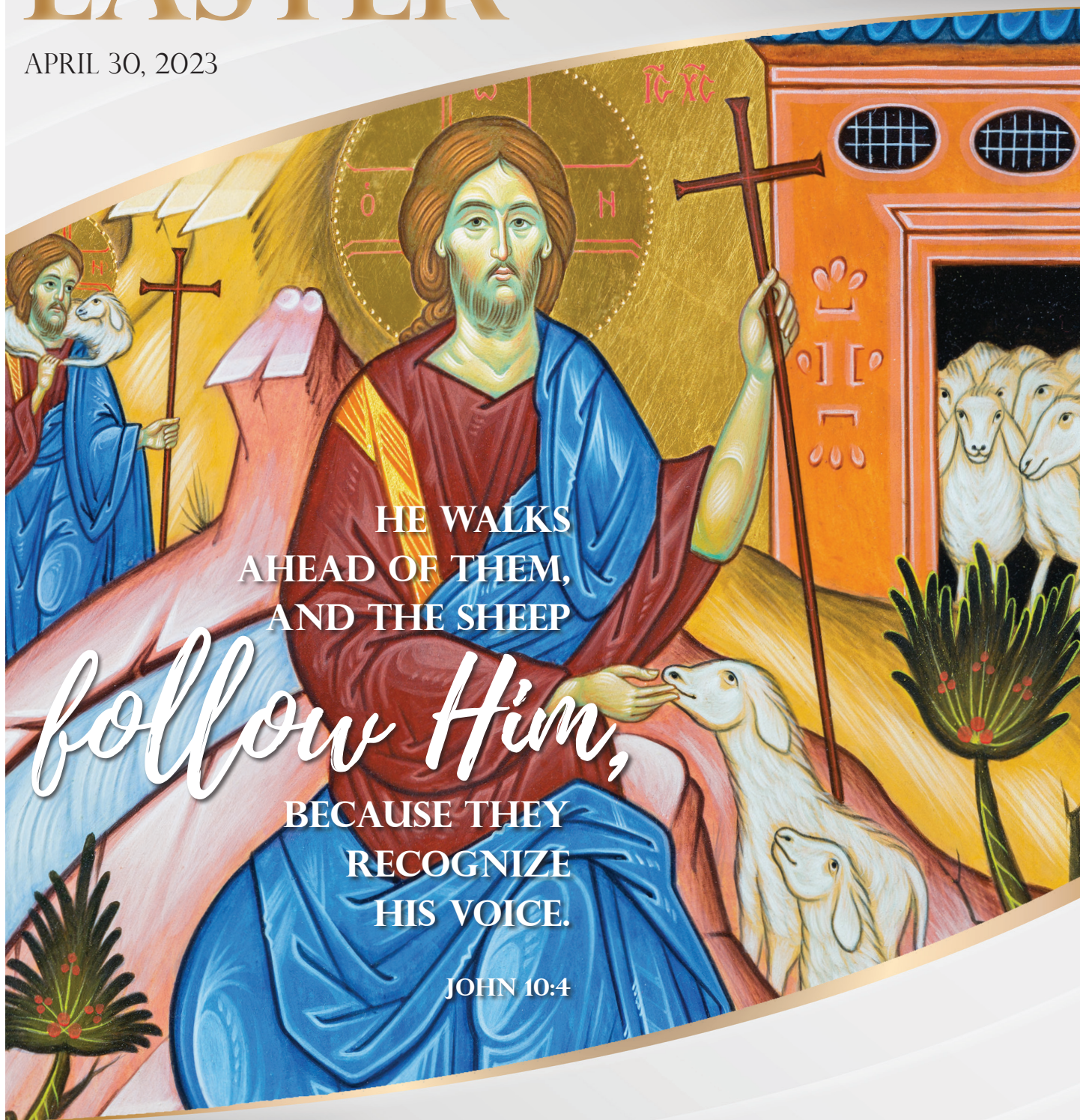

ST. JOHN THE BAPTIST

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

This **Fourth Sunday of Easter** is called “the **Good Shepherd Sunday**.”

Jesus Christ is our **Good Shepherd**.

He compares His love for His disciples to the love of a shepherd for his sheep.

This time of the year, when many young men are making choices, regarding their future, we are encouraged by our **Bishop Earl** to pray for the vocations to the priesthood.

Many times, I have asked myself: what happened to our **USA** society, that so many seminaries are empty or only a few candidates are being prepared for the future work as priests? My very next question is: what am I doing here?

Why can't I work in my country, **Poland**?

“What’s wrong with the young men of this country?”

Why do they play a game of the deaf man, when **Jesus** calls them to be **His** apostles?

Being a missionary, I had a chance to meet a lot of “old” **American** priests, especially during my service as missionary to **Papua New Guinea**.

Leo C. Arkfeld, S.V.D., joined the **Divine Word Missionaries** at the age of **twenty** and was ordained to the priesthood in **1943**. He was immediately stationed to **New Guinea** but, for a brief period, was relocated to **Australia** during **WWII**. There, he became a skilled and well-respected aviator. Upon resuming his ministry in **New Guinea**, he built numerous private airstrips along shorelines and hillsides, thus, permitting access to locales which allowed for him to carry out his ministry. He was credited with many emergency flights, in treacherous jungle and mountain areas, which saved many lives. He was ordained **Titular Bishop** and **Vicar Apostolic of Central New Guinea** in **1948**. He became the first **Bishop of Wewak** in **1966** and was **Archbishop of Madang, Papua New Guinea**, from **1975-87**. His ministry in **New Guinea** spanned **54 years**.

Father Frank Mihalic SVD was head of the **Communication Arts Department at Divine Word University** from **1982** until his retirement in **1997**. Originally sent to **Papua New Guinea** in **1948**, **Fr. Mihalic** wrote the first **English** lexicon of **Toks Pisin**, a form of **Melanesian Pidgin English** that is one of the country’s three official languages. **The Pennsylvania** native would write many more **Pidgin** dictionaries and grammar books, as well as a history of **Divine Word Missionaries in Papua New Guinea**.

And there were more great, dedicated, hardworking **American** missionaries – but not now. There is no replacement, no young men, no continuity in this great process of giving **God** their whole life in the service of preaching the **Good News** and serving our brothers and sisters in the spirit of **Jesus the Good Shepherd**.

So, let us pray for the vocations to the priesthood and try to encourage young and faithful men to answer **God’s** call: **Come follow me!**

The Fourth Sunday of Easter marks the **60th Anniversary** of the **World Day of Prayer for Vocations** instituted by **Pope Paul VI** in **1964**. Parishes are especially encouraged to include prayers for an increase in vocations to the priesthood and religious life.

Today's Gospel: The **Gospel** is from **St. John 10:1-10**. One of the oldest paintings of **Christ**, in the **Roman** catacombs, represents **Christ** as carrying the injured, straying sheep gently on **His** shoulders back to the sheepfold. This is an image of **Christ** which has always appealed to **Christians**. We have **Christ** as our shepherd – He tells us so Himself in today's Gospel – and we do not resent being called sheep in this context. There is something guileless about a sheep, and at the same time a lot of foolishness! But with **Christ** as our shepherd and the "**good shepherd**" who is interested in the true welfare of His flock, we have reason to rejoice.

Religious Brothers Day is celebrated annually on May 1, which is also the feast of Saint Joseph the Worker as well as International Workers Day (known as Labor Day in some countries). The common theme is that they honor the often low-profile work of keeping church, family, and society running. The men and women who take up these tasks deserve more than one day of thanks—even though they're usually the type who never expect it. Maybe you're blessed to be one of them, who humbly serves and sacrifices and asks for little in return. On this day, and every day, let our gratitude be shown and felt for all the workers who dedicate their lives to making our lives better.

TODAY'S READINGS: Acts 11:1-18; John 10:11-18 (279) or Genesis 1:26—2:3 or Colossians 3:14-15, 17, 23-24; Matthew 13:54-58 (559). "I am the good shepherd. A good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep."

Tuesday, May 02, 2023**Everything everywhere all the time**

Thank Saint Athanasius upon reciting the word "consubstantial"—which used to be "one in being with the Father"—the next time you say the Nicene Creed. Athanasius, as deacon, did the theological homework for his bishop, Saint Alexander I, at the Council of Nicea. Together they resisted Arianism. Prior to the council, the central idea of Arianism had been slowly gaining traction among church leaders: that Jesus wasn't God, wasn't co-equal and co-eternal with the Father as taught by the Christian doctrine of the Trinity. As Athanasius insisted of Jesus and the Incarnation, "there is no part of creation deprived of his presence; together with his Father, he fills everything, everywhere, at all times."

TODAY'S READINGS: Acts 11:19-26; John 10:22-30 (280). "The Father and I are one."

Wednesday, May 03, 2023**What remains is the legacy**

Today the church celebrates the feast of two of the 12 apostles, Philip and James, a peculiar pair of martyrs not otherwise associated with one another in Christian history or tradition. James (also called James the Less) is regarded as the first Bishop of Jerusalem, while Philip was said to have preached in Greece,

Turkey, and Syria. The pairing of their feast days is related to their shared reliquary in the Church of the Twelve Apostles, following a secret move from the Roman Catacombs. Thereafter lost to history for some time, their relics were rediscovered in the church crypt in the 19th century. On this holy feast, let's all remember the sacrifices of the church's first teachers and model their lives of holiness and faith.

TODAY'S READINGS: 1 Corinthians 15:1-8; John 14:6-14 (561).

"[Jesus] was raised on the third day . . . After that he appeared to James, then to all the Apostles."

Thursday, May 04, 2023**We are a people with a history**

When asked to speak at a gathering of the Jewish community in the early days of the church, Paul gives a history lesson. He recounts the liberating activity of God throughout Jewish history and ties God's activity directly to the arrival of Jesus the Messiah and the opening of salvation to all humanity. Our God is the God of history, and our human stories—personal and collective—are part of a much larger historical project of salvation. Play your part in the drama.

TODAY'S READINGS: Acts 13:13-25; John 13:16-20 (282). "Fellow children of Israel and you others who are God-fearing, listen. The God of this people Israel chose our ancestors."

Friday, May 05, 2023**Witness this**

Saints and martyrs are the shining lights when it comes to witnessing to Jesus the Christ, often giving their whole lives and their very lives to communicate God's great love. We too are called to be witnesses. "But I'm no saint!" one might protest. "I can't witness like that." You don't have to be! Pope Francis reminds us that "God guides history through the humble courage of those who pray, love, and forgive. There are so many hidden saints, saints who are next-door, hidden witnesses of life, who with little acts of love change history." Next time in prayer, ask God how you've been a hidden witness of God's great love.

TODAY'S READINGS: Acts 13:26-33; John 14:1-6 (283). "These are now his witnesses before the people. We ourselves are proclaiming this good news to you."

Saturday, May 06, 2023**Choose your destination**

Can someone really be destined, or "predestined," for eternal life? According to the Catechism of the Catholic Church, our destiny as beings created by God is eternal life. But because we are free, we can choose to opt out of that destiny. Just like the people invited to the wedding feast in the Lord's parable, we can decide not to come or simply fail to show up. Just so, when we choose to live in hate rather than love, in violence rather than peace, in punishment rather than forgiveness, we're choosing another destiny. The choice is ours to make.

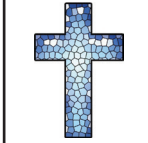
