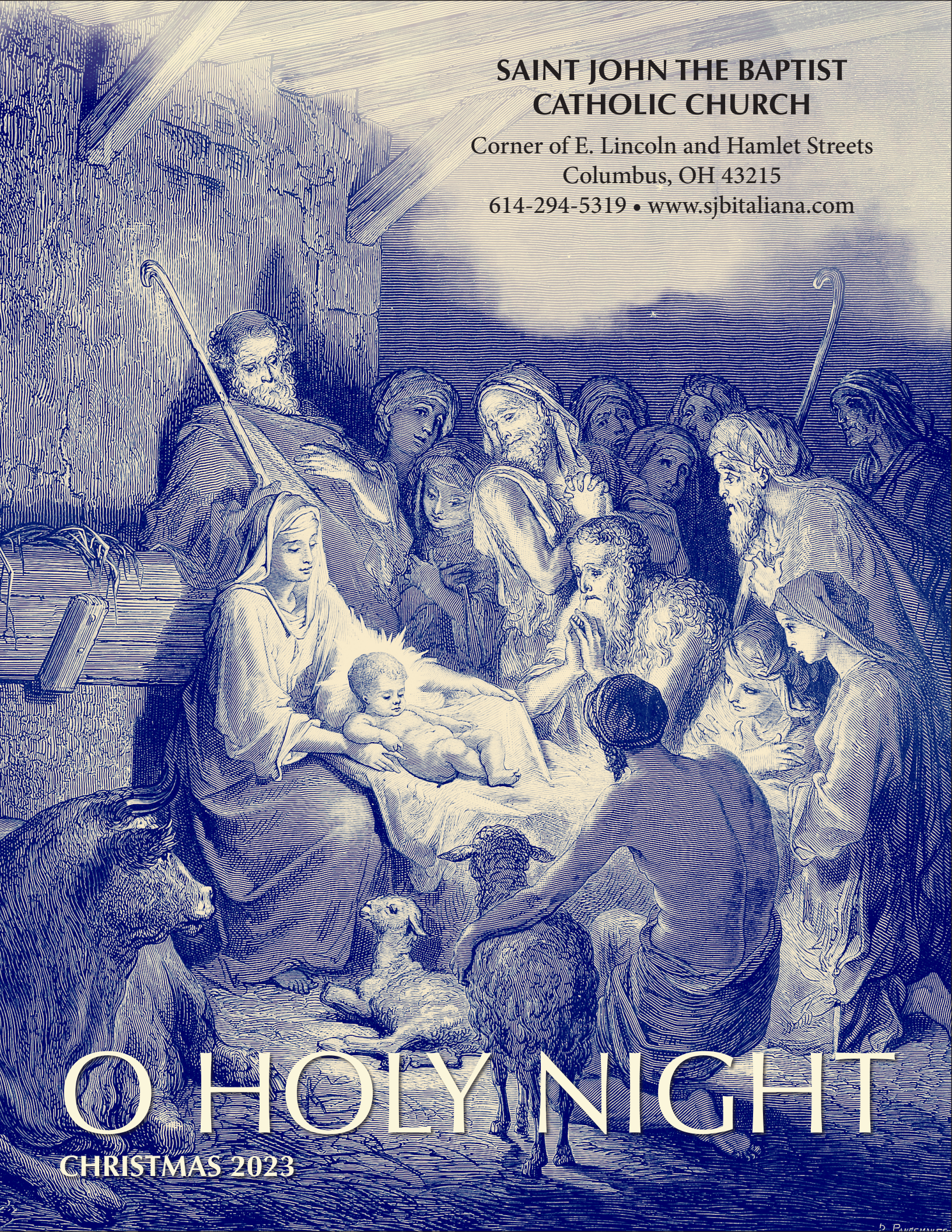

Dear Friends in Christ,

In the **December 17th** issue of **The Catholic Times**, **Bishop Fernandes** designated four churches in the **Diocese of Columbus** dedicated to the **Sacred Heart** as locations where the faithful can obtain a **Plenary Indulgence** during the **Jubilee 350th year of the apparition of the Sacred Heart to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque in Paray-le-Monial, France**. **Sacred Heart Parish on Hamlet Street in Columbus** is one of those four parishes.

A **Plenary Indulgence** is “a remission of the entire temporal punishment due for sin.” Even though **Confession** removes sin from our lives and gives us the opportunity for a new beginning in our life with **God**, we still experience the temporal consequences of our sins – damaged relationships, guilt, remorse, sadness, and the other consequences of our failures with which we are all familiar. This aftermath of sin is something we have earned and are asked to repent from and turn away from through our own type of personal suffering. The **Plenary Indulgence** graciously takes that debt in justice away and offers us internal peace.

To receive the **Plenary Indulgence**, the usual conditions are:

- **Assisting at Mass**
- **Sacramental Confession**
- **Holy Communion**
- **Making a Holy Hour of Reparation**
- **Reciting prayers such as the Litany of the Sacred Heart or other prayers**
- **A prayer for the Holy Father’s Intention**
- **A desire to be free from an attachment to sin**

Beginning on Thursday, January 11, 2024, Sacred Heart Church will be opened from 10:00 a.m. to 7:30 p.m. every Thursday during the Jubilee until the Feast of the Sacred Heart on June 27, 2025. During that time, the **Blessed Sacrament** will be exposed for **Adoration**, there will be **Mass** at **6:30 p.m.** followed by **Confessions** and **Benediction** until **7:30 p.m.**

The entire city of **Columbus** is invited to participate in this great opportunity and a very special invitation goes out to the people of our parishes, **Sacred Heart** and **St. John the Baptist in Italian Village**. In these troubled times in the country, the **Church**, and the world, this is a great opportunity for us to seek our own personal freedom from all darkness and to help to heal all in our world that is so broken.

Liturgical Calendar: The first eight days of **January** fall during the liturgical season of **Christmas** which is represented by the liturgical color white — the color of light, a symbol of joy, purity and innocence. The remaining days of **January** are the beginning of the liturgical season known as **Ordinary Time**, which is represented by the liturgical color green. Green is a symbol of and sparks in the faithful the hope of reaping the eternal harvest of heaven, especially the hope of a glorious resurrection. The month of **January** is dedicated to the **Holy Name of Jesus**, which is celebrated on **January 3**.

You are invited to pray for the Holy Father's Intentions for the Month of January 2024: We pray that the Holy Spirit may help us to recognize the gift of different charisms within the Christian community and to discover the richness of different traditions and rituals in the Catholic Church.

Christmas Plenary Indulgence: This Christmas season, Catholics can receive a plenary indulgence by praying in front of a **Nativity Scene** located in a **Franciscan church**. The indulgence will be available from **December 8 through February 2, 2024**. Those wishing to receive the indulgence must pray in front of a **Nativity Scene** at a **Franciscan church**. A **plenary indulgence** is a grace granted by the **Catholic Church** that removes the temporal punishment due to sin. To receive this indulgence, one must receive the **Holy Eucharist** and the **Sacrament of Confession** within **20 days** of praying in front of a **Nativity Scene**. In addition, those attempting to receive the indulgence must pray for the intentions of the **Holy Father**.



Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord: January 7:

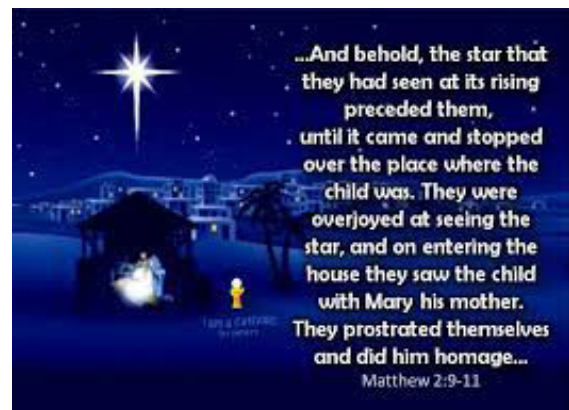
Today the Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord. "The Lord and ruler is coming; kingship is His, and government and power." With these words, the Church proclaims that today's feast brings to a perfect fulfillment all the purposes of **Advent**. **Epiphany, therefore, marks the liturgical zenith of the Advent-Christmas season.**

Today's Gospel: Today's Gospel is from the **Gospel of Matthew 2:1-12**. The **Magi** are central to today's **Feast of Epiphany**. They were pagans who did not know the true **God** of the **Jews**. Yet that true **God** revealed to them that the **King** He had promised to the **Jews** had come. The expected **Prince** was born. They came to **Jerusalem** expecting to find the city and the whole country rejoicing. Instead, they found suspicion and hatred in the reigning king – a hatred which in a few days turned to murder. Among the religious leaders, they found utter indifference. These leaders knew the **Messiah** would be born in **Bethlehem**; they must have realized that the **Magi** were very sure of the truth revealed to them – they would not have come such a long journey on a "fool's errand." Despite that, the thought of going to **Bethlehem** with the **Magi** never entered their minds. These were the leaders who some years later refused to listen to **Christ** despite His miracles and refused to admit His claim that He was not only the promised **Messiah**, but the true **Son of God**. These were men who rejected Him because He had mercy on sinners and spoke of a future life. What they wanted from their **Messiah** was political power and earthly freedom and prosperity. Like **Herod**, they ended with murder – the crucifixion of the "**King of the Jews**." The pagan king was not much worse than the indifferent leaders of **God's Chosen People**. Let us resolve to make the **Magi** our models, to follow them to **Bethlehem** and offer **Christ** all that we have and are.

Preparation of the Gifts

\pre-pə-'rā-shən | 'gifts

The set of ceremonial actions at Mass preceding the Eucharistic Prayer and Holy Communion. Includes dressing of the altar; bringing forward the bread and wine; and the community's personal sacrifices taken up in the collection. Formerly called the Offertory. The community offers a song of praise for all these gifts as the priest washes his hands in a purification rite.

CONTEXT

The **Preparation of the Gifts** allows time for the preparation of our hearts. Like the Magi bearing gifts and doing homage to Majesty, we bring our gifts and our praise to the Table.

God has first blessed us with the gift of creation. Humans take those gifts given, wheat and grapes, and, using our creativity, make bread and wine. Then, we bring those gifts we have received and labored over to present them at the Altar/Table that they might be transformed into the Body and Blood of Christ. Finally, we receive them back in Communion. The procession of the **Gifts** says, in essence, “Behold the gifts God has given us!”

WHY IT MATTERS

We take great care preparing other festive tables for our most cherished gatherings. Could we do less for the table where the Real Presence of Christ will be made tangible for us?

From the General Instructions of the Roman Missal: The altar or Lord's table, which is the center of the whole Liturgy of the Eucharist, is made ready. . . . The offerings are then brought forward. It is a praiseworthy practice for the bread and wine to be presented by the faithful (73).

QUESTION OF THE WEEK

Is Epiphany about giving or getting gifts?

“We three kings of Orient are/ bearing gifts we traverse afar.” Nowhere in the gospels does it claim there are three kings. They are magi, hereditary priests of the ancient Medes and Persians. At least the carol gets one thing right: this wise group does bear gifts. Gold symbolizes wealth and power. Frankincense, used in prayer, represents the divine Presence. Myrrh prepares bodies for burial. It's an ominous sign that would make a startling gift. . . . But they were appropriate honors for the King of the Universe, the Divine Son, and the crucified Lord.

We also bear Jesus gifts at every Eucharist: bread, wine, and our financial sacrifice. “Made by human hands,” these gifts are transformed and returned to us as the Body and Blood of Christ, and then redistributed for those in need.

More gifts come to us by way of this shared Table. Grace pours out on the assembly. Grace forgives sin, and rescues us from every evil. This is one gift you don't want to put at the bottom of a closet.
