RECONCILIATION/CONFESSIONE:

One half-hour prior to weekend Mass or by request/appointment.

BAPTISM/BATTESIMO:

Preparation is required for the reception of the sacrament.

Parents are encouraged to call the Rectory and set up an appointment before the birth of their child.

MATRIMONY/MATRIMONIO:

Arrangements should be made at least six or more months in advance. A marriage preparation program is required.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK/INFERMI:

In cases of emergencies, please call anytime. Please notify the Parish Office for Communion calls to the sick, shut-ins. Due to privacy laws, if parishioners wish to be visited in the hospital, they should contact the Parish Office directly and give the information regarding the hospitalization. **If you are scheduled for surgeries or other medical procedures**, please contact the Parish Office in advance so that a priest can administer Anointing of the Sick prior to the procedure.

ST. JOHN THE BAPTIST

Dear Friends in Christ,

Our parish has seen some changes recently. The bells that were struck by lightning have been repaired. They now ring hourly from **8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. daily**. Also, the **fire door** that broke and covered up the stained-glass window between the church and the chapel has been repaired. We went from a proposed **\$40,000.00 solution** to about a **\$200.00 solution** thanks to **Pat Rossetti's** initiative. We do still have some minor roof repairs in the area. We are also in the process of investigating major renovation of the doors in the Church and the **Halls**. We're receiving proposals for that now. We are also looking into repairing or replacing the folding doors in the classroom.

Lent continues at **St. John's**. We have evening **Mass** every **Wednesday at 6:00 p.m.** followed by a "**Simple Supper**" of homemade **soup, salad, bread, and drinks** in **Marrapese Hall** following **Mass**. Because of schedules, we do have **Stations of the Cross on Friday** evenings at **7:00 p.m.** but they are at **Sacred Heart**. I encourage all of you to offer some **Lenten** penance to the **Lord** for our parish and for the universal **Church** as she struggles for holiness and fidelity in a very complicated and often unfriendly world. We often don't think beyond our own environment but being part of the **Church** is being part of the solution to the world's problems. Each of us joins with the **Africans, Asians, Europeans, Australians, and Central and South Americans** in offering humanity a vision of hope and a desire for inner freedom and understanding. Too often, we forget to pray for the **Church**, and certainly, **Lent** is a time for us to remember to do that.

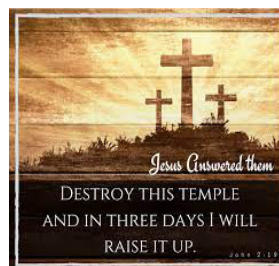

CHURCH REGULATIONS REGARDING FASTING AND ABSTINENCE DURING LENT: Abstinence from meat (beast or fowl) is to be observed by all **Catholics** fourteen years and older on **Ash Wednesday** and on all **Fridays of Lent**. This obligation prohibits the eating of meat, but not eggs, milk products or condiments of any kind, even though made from animal fat. The law of fasting on **Ash Wednesday and Good Friday** applies to all **Catholics from age 18 through age 59**. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. Those who are ill or pregnant may be dispensed from their obligation.

Anointing of the Sick

\ə-ˈnɔɪnt-tɪŋ ˈəv ˈθə
ˈsɪk\

A sacrament for the recovery and salvation of a critically ill or injured person formerly called Extreme Unction (“last **anointing**”). No longer reserved for those near death, one may be **anointed** before surgery, in extreme age or illness, after losing consciousness, or when no longer coherent.

Anointing of the Sick permits us to touch with our hands God’s compassion for humanity.

When the church **anoints** a sick person, it **anoints** a member of its own body.

By the grace of the sacrament of **Anointing of the Sick**, the sick person receives the strength and the gift of uniting more closely to Christ’s Passion.

WHY IT MATTERS

The mercy of God extends to the body as well as soul of each person. Jesus ministered to the sick and suffering both physically and spiritually. The church continues this ministry in its care for the whole person.

From *Rites of the Catholic Church as revised by Decree of the Second Vatican Ecumenical Council*: The Church obeys Jesus’ command to care for the sick by visiting those in poor health but also by raising them up through the **sacrament of Anointing** and by nourishing them with the Eucharist during their illness. The church offers prayers for the sick to commend them to God, especially in the last crisis of life.

QUESTION OF THE WEEK

What is the Anointing of the Sick?

One of the seven sacraments of the church, **Anointing of the Sick** recalls the healing presence and power of Jesus when we touch our mortality most vulnerably. From ancient times oil was valued for its healing and beautifying properties and in preparing bodies for burial.

The ordinary minister of the sacrament is the priest. However, it’s presumed that others share the event: family, friends, caregivers. Elements of the ritual include prayers, scripture, laying hands on the recipient, and **anointing** of the head and hands. A water sprinkling rite may be included, and affected areas of the sick person’s body may also be **anointed**. When in danger of death, additional sacraments of Reconciliation and Communion (*viaticum*, or “on the way with you”) are also administered.
